Ray Young went from Navy pilot to fighting boll weevils

At 80 years of age, there's not much that scares former Navy pilot Ray Young.

Once upon a time, when the United States was engaged in a police action against North Korea, Young piloted an AF Grumman Guardian, the Navy's largest single engine plane, as he and crew hunted for submarines in the South Pacific.

Official hostilities were over when Young was flying over the South Seas, so most of his assignments were training missions; still, flying under hostile conditions comes with a whole set of rules, regulations and warnings and it takes a special breed.

Pilots will always tell you that the tricky part to flying is not the actual flying, but the landing. Most pilots say that any landing you can walk away from is a good landing.

The problem for Young in landing the Guardian was the landing strip—the 550-foot deck of the U.S.S. Sicily, a baby flattop.

"The deck was so short, they'd have to use a catapult to launch us," Young said.

That short deck must have looked even shorter when

it came time to land. It must have reminded Young of a fishing cork bobbing and tossing in the middle of the raging blue sea. Unafraid, Young completed all of his flight missions successfully.

Discharged from the Navy as a Lieutenant, Junior Grade, Young returned to his home state of Louisiana and settled near Wisner with his wife, Dorothy, in 1955.

Determined to resume his civilian life as an agricultural consultant, his biggest enemy now was not the threat of Communist aggression. It was the tiny boll weevil.

Probably the only thing Young was afraid of was that nobody knew much about what an ag consultant did back in 1955.

Young recalls there wasn't a lot of call for advising a farmer about his crops back in 1948 when he was a teenager studying agriculture at Louisiana


Tech.

"Dan Logan was a Caddo Parish farmer near Gilliam," Young said. "He was an innovator."

What were these innovations?

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

LDAF accepting specialty crop grant applications

Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) is seeking applications for projects that solely enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops like fruits, vegetables and nuts for inclusion into Louisiana's state grant proposal for the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program.

Applications must be submitted no later than May 7, 2010.

Strain said more than \$351,800 is available for the grant program.

"This is a great opportunity for stakeholders in the Louisiana specialty crop markets to improve their competitiveness," Strain said.

In addition to fruits, vegetables and nuts, the grant will enhance projects that benefit dried fruits, horticulture and nursery crops, including floriculture.

Under the grant guidelines, state non-profit organizations and corporations, commodity associations, state and local government entities, and colleges and univer-

sities may be eligible.

Applicants and/or their business or educational affiliation must be located in Louisiana, according to grant specifications.

The Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008, commonly known as the 2008 Farm Bill, amended the Specialty Crops Competiveness Act of 2004 that authorized the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) to provide grants to states for each of the fiscal

years 2008 through 2012 solely to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops.

Strain said guidelines and applications may be viewed at the LDAF Web site at www.LDAF.la.gov.

Young is seated at a household table in the office/kitchen of his metal barn on Hwy. 572 in Franklin Parish. He's wearing a typical farmer's uniform: khaki pants and shirt, and a light jacket with the cotton trademark insignia embroidered on the front.

Outside, several John Deere tractors are parked. Young's 49-year-old son, Jesse, is out working a field on another tractor. Two large grain bins tower over the barn.

Young listens to the question and his smile comes easy. His broad grin reveals the deep lines a farmer cultivates over the years in his face. The crow's feet came from driving an open tractor. The furrows in his brow no doubt came from the hassles of working a wet field. The laugh lines came from the joy of another successful harvest.

"Mr. Logan said we ought to look at these fields before we dust 'em," Young said.

Young said that treatments, like Paris Green mixed with lead arsenate and flour, could kill the infamous boll weevil. At that time, most farmers treated their crops with no particular rhyme or reason in mind.

More effective chemicals kept coming down the pike but still farmers didn't apply a real strategy when it came to dealing with the weevil pest.

Young remembers applying Paris Green mixed with flour straight from the sack.

"Some people put a stick over the horse's back and hung two bags of Paris Green and flour and dusted two rows at a time," Young said. "We were never that high-tech at my daddy's farm."

Young earned a general agriculture degree from Louisiana Tech in 1950. Before shipping out to the

Pacific, he also worked for two years under the watchful eye of Logan and Ralph Penuell, a senior student at the university.

They developed a method for scouting cotton fields and devised a strategy for controlling boll weevils and other cotton pests.

Before the dawn of ag consultancy, Young said harvest yields of a half-bale of cotton per acre was the norm in hill country farms like his daddy's in Hico, Lincoln Parish.

Logan's fields, along the Red River, did considerably better, Young said.

"He was getting a bale and a half per acre," Young says. "That was a good yield anywhere in Louisiana at that time."

Farmers paid attention to Penuell and Young's work.

"People began to notice and pretty soon everybody wanted their fields scouted," Young said. "We used three fellows. Two would walk through the field making observations while the other one drove the Ford Model A around to the other side of the field. The driver would then walk through the field making notes."

When Young returned from the Pacific, he looked at an agricultural map of Louisiana.

"I figured if I wanted to help people with the cotton crop I had to go where the biggest cotton patch was," Young said. "Franklin Parish was growing a lot of cotton. I went door to door telling farmers what I did and people hired me."

He called his fledgling service Ray Young Insect Control.

A lot of Louisiana farmers think of Young as the Father of Ag Consultancy.

"Cotton is a crop where a farmer needs to make a decision every

day," Young says. "Modern consulting is not just about the boll weevil, but now we help the farmer with decisions about diseases, irrigation and cultural methods. Basically, every decision a farmer makes, a consultant has a part."

Young brought in his son, Jesse, into the consulting business in 1983 and renamed the service Young and Young Consulting.

Today, Young said he's doing less consulting and more farming. He and his son are cultivating 1500 acres in cotton and corn and rent out another 1500 acres of land to other growers.

They've already decided to plant only 400 acres of cotton in 2010.

Young said he only learned how to plant and grow cotton in the gumbo soil of Franklin Parish in the 1980s.

Learned how to plant cotton? You'd think after 50 or so years of farming he'd have mastered cotton. Not exactly, Young says.

"This is heavy land," Young says. "It doesn't get very dry to plow in the spring. We just did normal tillage like we always did, but you could never plant a cotton crop early. It was always late. But when you planted late, guess what? You harvested late and then the fall rains set in and you rut the field up real bad. So you get hooked in a cycle: plant late, pick late, rut the ground, rut holds water next spring, it won't dry so you plant late, pick late and you just get in a vicious cycle."

"We'd go over this land with a disc or chisel plow eight times before we ever planted. In 1983, we said we can't keep planting cotton because we can't plant early enough. And not many folks were even trying to plant cotton in this black land because you couldn't plant early enough."



Ray Young officially brought his son, Jesse, into the ag consultancy and family farm business in 1983. Young said he would have never tried the stale bed method of planting cotton without Jesse's help and youthful attitude.

"We had to do something different. In 1983, Young and Young said we're not going to plow in the spring. If we plow, it's going to be in the fall and we're not going to do much of that anymore. In '84, we didn't plow. We just went out and planted. It didn't look very good. It didn't look very good at all. It was ugly. We didn't know if it was going to work at all but it did and we thought we were on to something. So we did it again."

Two years later Earl Manning of Progressive Farmer came out to Gilbert and wrote a story on Young and Young's innovative cotton farming techniques.

The Youngs went out and consulted with farmers and told them how they were bringing in their cotton

crop using what they termed "stale bed" farming.

"You're planting cotton on a bed or ridge, a stale bed, from last fall that has not been tilled," Young said. "Just about everybody in the world in Louisiana, Alabama and Mississippi are doing it this way now."

Young never said he wasn't afraid to do things differently. He never said he wasn't afraid to land that big old plane on a tiny ship in the middle of the ocean. He never said he wasn't afraid to approach a subsistence farmer and advise him on better ways to farm. And he never said he wasn't afraid to try the stale bed method of cotton farming on the gumbo dirt of Northeast Louisiana.

But he had the courage.

A panel of small business managers at the LSU AgCenter's Market Gardening Seminar on March 6 said their customers like to buy locally grown produce and flowers and would welcome more local suppliers.

Michael Brady, chef at Wine Country Bistro in Shreveport, said he builds relationships with his local suppliers, and his customers like knowing the food he serves is "from right around the corner."

"It's all about earth to plate," said Jason Brady, owner of Wine Country Bistro. "Local is the trump card of all trump cards."

The Bradys have toyed with the idea of offering a locally grown dinner featuring "John's beets and Gary's potatoes" and have the local growers tell about their operations.

The seminar was held for commercial growers at all levels, both start-up and experienced, said Denyse Cummins, LSU AgCenter horticulturist.

The panel also included Randy Hamacker, owner of Sunshine Health Foods of Shreveport, and Nona Fowler-Sandlin, manag-

er of Shreveport Farmers' Market.

Hamacker said he would welcome sales of produce and fresh flowers in booths outside of his Shreveport store.

Fowler-Sandlin said 2009 was the market's biggest year, drawing 37,908 visitors. The number of vendors has also jumped, and they come from Texas and Arkansas as well as Louisiana, one as far as 127 miles.

According to a recent study of the farmers market, shoppers came from 42 zip codes, and almost half attend every week. Shoppers spent \$25.64 per visit at the market and an average of an additional \$60.98 at other area businesses, she said.

Other topics at the seminar included weed management, vegetable varieties, soil improvement and planting for continuous production.

Jimmy Boudreaux, LSU AgCenter commercial vegetable specialist, offered the following suggestions for produce growers to enhance their sales:

- If you're going to grow eggplant, grow different colors and shapes.
- Artichokes make a beautiful purple flower that you can sell.
- Square or five-sided okra doesn't sell.
- The secret to growing beets is to keep them moist.
- Cabbage has to weigh 2 to 3 pounds for market, and the leaves need to grow upright, not flat.

New scholarship available to north and central Louisiana 4-H'ers

A new college scholarship is available for north and central Louisiana 4-H'ers through a \$20,000 donation from Hilda D. Williams and her children, Rosy Williams Bromell, Vickie Williams Phelps and Donald Vardaman Williams.

The Hilda D. Williams and Vardaman Williams Jr. Scholarship will award \$500 to an outstanding 4-H'er from central or north Louisiana, said Eric Eskew, executive director of the Louisiana 4-H Foundation.

Eligible recipients must be graduating high school seniors who were active in 4-H and will be enrolling as full-time undergraduate students in any two- or four-year college in Louisiana.

The late Vardaman Williams was a 4-H member, leader and volunteer for more than 40 years. As a youth, he raised and showed chickens and steers.

A dairy, hog and beef farmer, Vardaman Williams was manager of the State Fair of Louisiana Dairy Barn and Milking Parlor from 1983 to 1997.

He was Caddo Parish Young Farmer of the Year in 1956 and was awarded the Caddo Parish Award for Outstanding 4-H Leader posthumously in 1998.

His wife, Hilda, a 4-H'er in 1940 and a volunteer leader for sewing clinics and freezing and canning clinics from 1958 to 1995, resides in Keithville. She was a member of the Louisiana Volunteers for Family and Community for 52 years and has purchased animals at the State Fair

of Louisiana for more than 20 years.

Both Hilda and Vardaman Williams were nominated for the 4-H Hall of Fame.

"Our family has been blessed in recent years, so this is our way of giving back," Bromell said. "4-H has been a large part of our lives, especially when we were young."

The three Williams children showed livestock - Vickie and Rosy showed dairy cows and pigs, and Donald showed beef steers. Each won the Superintendent's Award and Governor's Award as a 4-H'er and attended 4-H Club Congress in Chicago.

"We all feel fortunate to have grown up in a family that supported us in 4-H and in the other activities we participated in as youths - including band, pep squad, football, baseball and other activities," Bromell said.

"This generous donation from the Williams family will help north Louisiana 4-H'ers graduating from high school continue their post-secondary education and successfully

enter the workforce," said Paul Coreil, vice chancellor of the LSU AgCenter.

"For generations, the Williams family has participated in numerous 4-H projects and activities as dedicated 4-H members and volunteer leaders," Coreil said.
