

Money-making opportunities may lie within eucalyptus trees

A tree from Down Under could help provide rural Louisiana landowners with additional cash by putting idle property to work.

LSU AgCenter scientists are involved in a joint research project with Texas A&M University to find the best growing methods for eucalyptus on land normally used for cutover pine forests and on idle pasture and farmland.

The LSU AgCenter recently sponsored a tour of eucalyptus test plots in Beauregard Parish near Merryville. Eucalyptus is also being grown in southeast Texas.

The tree matures to a size suitable for harvesting as pulpwood in six to eight years, reaching up to 70 feet tall, compared to pine trees that require 12 to 15 years to reach that size.

A paper mill at Evadale, Texas, wants to use eucalyptus to meet shortfalls in pulpwood that occurs during wet months that prevent loggers from harvesting pine and hardwood trees.

Michael Blazier, LSU AgCenter forestry specialist, said MeadWestvaco Corp., the company that owns the Evadale, Texas, paper mill, has planted 3,000 acres in Texas and Louisiana, and the company has been expanding that amount by about 1,000 acres each year since 2007.

Once cellulosic ethanol is developed, eucalyptus would be an excellent feedstock, Blazier said. Plants that could produce wood pellets for the home heating market are being built in the United States, with one nearing completion in southeast Louisiana, he said.

He said eucalyptus has been hybridized, and cold-tolerant varieties are being developed.

Much of Blazier's work has focused on eliminating competing vegetation by using herbicides when eucalyptus is first planted.

"It's less forgiving than southern pine when it comes to competition," Blazier said.

After three to four years, he said, the trees establish a full canopy that blocks sunlight and hinders growth of other vegetation. It also requires fertilizers to get established.

Because eucalyptus is difficult to establish without intensive cultivation, its threat as an invasive species like the Chinese tallow tree is low, Blazier said.

Joe Pitcherelle Jr., eucalyptus operations manager for Meadwestvaco, said eucalyptus pulp makes high quality paper and has high energy potential.

He said eucalyptus chips can be used for landscaping. "Eucalyptus makes one of the best mulches out there."

John Johnson of Meadwestvaco said the company is interested in leasing tracts of at least 50 acres. The company would plant the trees, maintain them and harvest the crop.

Johnson said some species grow well in heavy clay soil, are relatively salt tolerant, and can recover from hurricane damage.

"Hurricane Ike pretty much laid everything flat," he said. Now the trees have recovered and are growing with just a few signs of the storm's effects.


Paul Coreil, LSU AgCenter vice chancellor for extension, said he was impressed with the potential of eucalyptus for Louisiana.

"This could be a viable option for idle farmland right now for the prairie land of southwest Louisiana," Coreil said.

Crawfish myths debunked

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. said the Louisiana crawfish season is in full swing.

“Crawfish are a healthy food choice,” Strain said. “It’s low in cholesterol and can fit in many diet plans.”

Strain said LSU AgCenter nutritionist Beth Reames debunked several common myths in a recent article published by the AgCenter.

The first is that crawfish are high in fat and cholesterol.

“Crawfish actually are low in fat, saturated fat and trans fat,” Reames said. “Three ounces of cooked crawfish tailmeat contain 116 milligrams of cholesterol, about a third of the maximum daily amount recommended by the 2005 Dietary Guidelines and the American Heart

Association.”

Reames said the bright yellow to orange crawfish “fat” squeezed from the heads and sticking to the tail meat is not fat in the usual sense. It actually is an organ in the head called the hepatopancreas that functions much like the liver in other animals.

“The pure fat content of this material is probably 30 percent. But as packaged for use in cooking, it may be closer to 10 percent,” Reames said. “On the other hand, cholesterol content of the pure head “fat” is high – more than 500 milligrams per 100 grams or 3.5 ounces.”

Reames says the second myth is that crawfish don’t fit in a heart-healthy eating plan.

High intakes of saturated fats,

trans fats and cholesterol may raise unhealthy blood lipids and increase heart disease risk, she said. But because crawfish are low in fat, saturated fat, trans fat and calories and are high in protein and minerals, they can be included in the diet of anyone who is concerned about cholesterol, fat or calories.

Although shellfish – shrimp, crabs and crawfish – tend to be higher in cholesterol than fish, poultry and meat, a 3-ounce serving of farm-raised crawfish cooked with moist heat provides 116 milligrams cholesterol.

“Crawfish fat is mostly unsaturated and contains a high proportion of omega-3 fatty acids that seem to significantly reduce the risk of heart disease and stroke,” the nutritionist said. “It’s important

to remember, however, that frying or preparing crawfish in rich sauces adds extra calories and fat.”

Another crawfish myth says a crawfish with a straight tail on a plate of cooked crawfish means it was dead before cooking.

Reames said studies at the LSU AgCenter have shown that a crawfish with a straight tail after boiling may or may not have been dead before cooking and is not necessarily spoiled. Sometimes crowded conditions in the boiling pot will prevent the tail of a live crawfish from curling.

“So the bottom line on straight and curled tails is that a straight tail doesn’t mean the crawfish was dead when it went into the pot and a curled tail doesn’t mean it was alive,” Reames said. “It’s impor-

tant to follow recommended food safety guidelines to keep food safe to eat.”

“We believe Louisiana crawfish are the best,” Strain said. “So if you want to eat crawfish, make sure it’s Louisiana crawfish.”

Delectable Crawfish Dishes

Hot Crawfish Loaves

½ cup flour	Salt & pepper to taste
½ cup melted butter	Dash of hot pepper sauce
3 cup milk	1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat
½ onion, chopped	1 cup chopped mushrooms
¼ cup chopped bell pepper	1 sm. jar chopped pimento, drained
¼ cup minced celery	Individual French bread loaves

Make a cream sauce by blending flour into melted butter and slowly adding milk, whisking until creamy. Sauce should be fairly thick. In another pan, sauté onion, bell pepper and celery in a little butter until onion is golden. Add to sauce. Season with salt, pepper and hot sauce. Stir in crawfish, mushrooms and pimentos. Stir until heated thoroughly. Cut French bread loaves in half, heat and fill with hot crawfish mixture.

Three-Cheese Crawfish Quiche

½ cup chopped onions	½ cup shredded mozzarella cheese
1 tbsp. vegetable oil	5 eggs, beaten
2 cups cooked rice	2/3 cup light cream
1 med. tomato, chopped & drained	1 tsp. Cajun/Creole seasoning
salt and pepper to taste	¼ tsp. nutmeg
1 cup chopped, cooked spinach	¼ tsp. cayenne pepper
2 cups Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese
½ cup shredded Swiss cheese	

Cook onions in oil in large skillet over medium heat. Stir in rice and tomato, reserve ¼ cup of tomato, salt and pepper. Cook 2-3 minutes. Press rice into a greased 9" deep-dish pie plate. Spread spinach over rice mixture, top with crawfish, then with Swiss and mozzarella cheeses. Combine eggs, cream, seasoning, nutmeg, and cayenne in a small bowl. Pour over cheese layer. Sprinkle with reserved tomato, then with Parmesan cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes or until firm and golden brown. Serves 6.

Crawfish Corn Fritters

5 green onions, thinly sliced	3 (12-oz. cans) niblet corn, drained
2 garlic cloves, pressed	½ lb. crawfish tailmeat, chopped
½ tsp. salt	3 eggs, beaten
1 tbsp. cornstarch	Oil for frying
¼ tsp. pepper	Prepared tartar or remoulade sauce

In a medium bowl, mix together all ingredients except oil and sauce. Heat 1/4" oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Spoon batter, one tablespoon at a time, into hot oil. Fry, turning once, until browned on both sides, about 3 minutes. Drain on paper towels and serve warm or at room temperature with tartar or remoulade sauce.

Salsa Picante with Crawfish

1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	3 jalapeno peppers, seeded & chopped
2 avocados, peeled & cubed	1 tbsp. ground cumin
¼ cup lime juice	2 tbsp. paprika
3 cups cubed tomatoes	1 tsp. salt
3 lg. onions, chopped	Lettuce leaves
8-10 cloves garlic, minced	Tortilla chips
¼ cup chopped cilantro	

Rinse crawfish with cold water. Drain well and pat dry. Coarsely chop and set aside. Combine avocados and lime juice in a small bowl. Set aside. Combine crawfish, tomatoes, onions, garlic, cilantro, peppers, cumin, paprika and salt in a large bowl. Gently stir in avocado-lime mixture. Chill at least 1 hour. Serve in a lettuce lined bowl with tortilla chips. Makes about 12 cups.

Spicy Crawfish & Spinach

3 (10-oz. pkgs.) frozen chopped spinach	½ tsp. black pepper
1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	½ tsp. celery salt
6 tbsps. butter	1 tsp. garlic salt
3 tbsps. flour	8 oz. grated Monterey Jack cheese
½ cup chopped onion	1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
¾ cup evaporated milk	½ cup bread crumbs
¾ cup spinach liquor	¼ cup sliced almonds, optional
¼ tsp. cayenne pepper	

Cook spinach according to package directions. Drain and reserve liquor. In a large saucepan, melt butter over low heat. Add flour, stirring until blended and smooth, but not brown. Add liquids slowly, stirring constantly to avoid lumps, until smooth and thick. Add seasonings, cheese and Worcestershire, stirring until cheese is melted. Add spinach to cheese mixture. Stir in crawfish. Pour into a greased 9x13 inch casserole. Top with bread crumbs and almonds, if desired. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes.

Crawfish Eleganté

1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	1 pint half and half
1 ½ sticks of butter	3 tablespoons flour (level)
1 small bunch green onions, chopped	3 tablespoons sherry
½ cup chopped parsley	Salt and red pepper to taste

In one skillet, sauté crawfish in ½ stick of butter for 10 to 15 minutes. In a second skillet, sauté onions and parsley in one stick of butter. Blend in flour and gradually add half and half stirring constantly to make a thick sauce. Add sherry and crawfish tails. Season with salt and pepper to taste. This may be used with pasta, rice in a chafing dish with Melba toast or over chicken, fish or steaks.

To burn or not to burn. That is the question on the minds of state forestry officials when considering prescribed burns.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry District 6 Manager Kirk Casanova says landowners should consider using prescribed burns to reduce accumulated fallen pine needles and dead wood as a potential wildfire fuel.

Prescribed burns can also be an efficient way to prepare and clear a site for future planting. They also reduce competition in newly reforested fields for species like longleaf pine and other slow growers.

When executed properly by qualified individuals, burning is a safe, effective, efficient and economical method for forest management.

Stretching from Point Coupee eastward to Washington Parish, District 6 encompasses the entire southeastern part of the state.

Casanova said the winter months between November and April are optimal for prescribed burns since the fallen pine needle and dead wood fuel is dry and easily ignited.

"There is such a small window of when you can burn because of weather conditions and other factors. On a good day we are trying to do as much as we can," Casanova

said. "I never know whether we're going to burn until about 9:30 or 10 a.m."

Not only is Casanova checking conventional weather forecasts, he also reviews fire weather forecasts before he will make a decision to proceed with a burn. The predictions contain critical data he uses to decide if it is safe for prescribed burns on a given day. The information also helps with smoke management and tells Casanova how the fire will behave.

"I pull the wildfire and prescribed burn reports from the day before. I look at the national weather service report from Slidell and get the relative humidity, temperature, morning mixing height, afternoon mixing height and category day," Casanova said. "All of these factors are like a prescription we write for a tract. If one factor is off, then I can't burn that day because I'm not in prescription."

Morning and afternoon mixing heights are data that indicate how well the smoke will rise and dissipate into the atmosphere, Casanova explained. The category day is the likelihood a fire will start and is measured on a scale from one, indicating a low fire danger, to five, indicating extreme fire

danger.

Casanova said to be able to prescribe a burn, the temperatures should not be above 85 degrees, that morning and evening mixing height levels should not be less than 500 meters and the relative humidity should be greater than 30 percent.

"We are behind schedule because of the rain we've had every two or three days this year. We're trying to catch up but it has been a terrible year for prescribed burns so far.

"The crew is sitting there like, 'what are we going to do, boss,'" Casanova said. "Since my top priorities are the safety of my fire crews and the public, I tell them to just wait."

Casanova considers a number of variables before conducting a prescribed burn. Are there schools and nursing homes in the area? Are there adjacent neighborhoods, roads or other smoke sensitive areas to consider? When he can answer these questions satisfactorily, the burn can proceed.

Once Casanova gives the go-ahead, fire crews begin cutting fire breaks with bull dozers at critical locations. The fire breaks define the area that will be burned. On this

particular day, Casanova said humidity was higher than he likes to see so the crews waited until after lunch to allow the ground to heat up and dry up excess moisture before beginning the burn.

LDAF firefighters, decked out in regulation fire gear, get to work quickly. Using a drip torch, they dispense ignited fuel around the perimeter of the tract. The whole place is up in controlled flames in quick order.

Casanova and LDAF Assistant Parish Forestry Supervisor Tony Bennett keep a close eye on the fire and pay special attention to the smoke. Casanova patrols the adjacent neighborhood and is pleased with the result. The smoke is doing exactly as he planned, lifting high and dispersing.

Last year the LDAF responded to 1,525 calls for wildfire suppression. More than 15,288 acres of timberland was damaged at a value of \$8 million to \$20 million depending on the devastation of the fire. With adequate forest management practices the landowner can significantly reduce the occurrence and severity of wildfires.

The LDAF charges a nominal fee to landowners to conduct prescribed burns.

Casanova stressed that only qualified individuals should conduct prescribed burns. For more information about prescription burning, contact 225-925-4500.
