
President Jeff Kleinpeter and East Baton Rouge Parish District Attorney Hillar Moore, III.

Daylilies are coming into bloom now, and gardeners would be hard pressed to find a plant that provides so many colorful flowers for so little effort. Available in an amazing variety of colors, shapes and sizes, you can find daylilies to fit virtually every taste and garden situation.

Although not a true lily, the daylily is a member of the lily family. Its botanical name, *Hemerocallis*, is derived from two Greek words meaning "day" and "beauty" and refers to the fact that daylily flowers last only a day before they fade. This might seem a major flaw, but these plants produce so many flowers over an extended period, you hardly notice that each one lasts such a brief time.


Breeders have developed the daylily into an incredibly diverse plant. With careful variety selection, you can have daylilies in bloom from late spring to early fall. The height of various varieties ranges from 8 inches to several feet – including the flowers – and the diameter of the blooms may vary from 2 1/2 inches to as large as 8 or 9 inches. The flowers come in a multitude of color combinations including yellow, orange, rose, burgundy, purple, pink, cream, lavender, red and many others.

Daylilies have three types of foliage habit. Dormant daylilies lose their foliage completely during the winter. New foliage appears in the spring. Evergreen daylilies retain their foliage throughout the year. Semi-evergreen daylilies' foliage dies part way back in the winter, but after a brief rest, begins to grow again. Gardeners in our area should grow evergreen or semi-evergreen types.

Most daylilies bloom best in full sun. They will tolerate partial shade but require at least six hours of direct sun each day for best results. Light yellow varieties, many shades of pink and delicate pastels need full sun to bring out the colorings, while deeper colors may benefit from shade in the hottest part of the day.

Any good garden soil is fine for growing daylilies. They thrive in a variety of soils, ranging from light sandy types to heavy clays. To get any soil in good physical condition, dig it deeply and work in generous amounts of organic matter such as well-rotted manure, compost or peat moss. This organic matter helps maintain good tilth, retain soil moisture and act as a storehouse for plant nutrients. For best performance, plant daylilies in well-drained soil.

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

Agribusiness Loan Program Phase 2 begins

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., and Louisiana Recovery Authority (LRA) Executive Director Robin Keegan said eligible agribusiness owners who suffered damages from hurricanes Gustav and Ike will have another opportunity to apply for low-interest loans through the Louisiana Agribusiness Recovery Loan Program.

In 2009, LDAF's Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority (LAFA) distributed more than \$40 million to about 1,100 Louisiana farmers, ranchers and agribusiness owners to aid their recovery from losses caused by hurricanes Gustav and Ike through the Louisiana Farm and Agribusiness

Recovery Grant and Loan programs.

After last year's program, all of the \$34.5 million set aside for farmers was disbursed, but \$2.2 million remains available for a second phase of the agribusiness program.

"These recovery programs were incredibly successful last year," Strain said. "We were able to deliver tens of millions of much needed dollars directly into the hands of Louisiana's farmers, ranchers and agribusiness owners."

"Agribusinesses help our Louisiana farmers and ranchers bring their products to market and contribute to a multibillion dollar industry that employs thousands across the state," Keegan said.

"Providing this additional aid will help these businesses through the tough economic times they've faced since Gustav and Ike came ashore in 2008."

The Agribusiness Recovery Program provides low-interest loans to agribusinesses like aerial applicators, cotton gins and elevators, and loggers.

"Our state's agricultural sector has endured financial hardships caused by natural disasters and high fuel and fertilizer costs which are forcing many individuals out of business," Strain said. "Agribusinesses like feed stores, aerial applicators and grain elevators are vital to Louisiana's agricultural community."

Both the Louisiana Farm and Agribusiness Recovery programs

are funded using U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, which the LRA set aside for aid to the agriculture community after it suffered great losses caused by 2008 storms. In total, Louisiana received more than \$1 billion in CDBG funding for recovery.

Agribusiness owners that already received a loan during the first phase of the program are not eligible to reapply but owners that applied and were denied may reapply.

The application period for Phase 2 is April 19 through May 28. Completed applications must be postmarked or hand delivered and date stamped by the LDAF no later

Early spring or late fall are the most desirable planting times; however, well-established plants grown in containers and bought locally can be planted virtually anytime. Space daylilies 18 to 24 inches apart. Some varieties multiply fast, and the clumps will become crowded if planted too close to each other.

Although daylilies generally don't need to be pampered, an adequate supply of water will ensure peak performance, especially the first year after planting. During the summer, plants should be watered once or twice a week when weather is hot and dry. Water deeply, soaking the soil to a depth of 6-8 inches, and water each week when there is not at least 1 inch of rainfall. A 2-inch mulch of leaves or pine straw will help conserve moisture and reduce weed problems.

A single application of a complete fertilizer in March is generally adequate, although a second application could be made in June. Use any general-purpose fertilizer. A final application

can be made in early fall as a new surge of growth occurs on many varieties. Keep the fertilizer off the foliage and water it into the soil after applying.

Aphids are the most serious insect pest of daylilies. They are most common in the late winter and early spring and cause the leaves and flowers to be unhealthy and deformed. Treatment with the insecticide acephate is effective if the infestation is severe enough to warrant it.

You need to be aware of a new fungus disease called daylily rust that is causing concern. Daylily rust was first reported in the Southeastern United States in 2000 and has spread rapidly to many states, including Louisiana. The disease causes the foliage to yellow and brown. Turn an infected leaf over, and you will see raised orange spots on the back of the leaf. The rusty orange spores will rub off on your finger. Susceptibility of daylily varieties to this disease varies – some are very sus-

ceptible and others seem fairly resistant. Gardeners have the choice of eliminating the very susceptible cultivars that show the worst symptoms and retaining those that don't seem to be bothered as much by the disease.

Should you decide to treat the disease, the infected plant should be cut within an inch of the ground, and it and all the plants around it should be sprayed regularly with a fungicide. Recommended fungicides include mancozeb (Dithane, Fore), chlorothalonil (Daconil), azoxystrobin (Heritage), propiconizol (Banner Maxx) and triadimefon. Applications may need to be repeated as often as every seven to 14 days. Follow product label instructions carefully.

It's likely that the best solution to this problem will be to use existing and newly developed varieties that are resistant to the disease. More information on daylily rust can be found on the Internet at www.daylilies.org/ahs_dictionary/daylily_rust.html.

Eggstraordinary Egg Dishes

Cool 'n' Crunchy Egg Salad

4 oz. (about 1/2 cup) cream cheese, softened	1/2 cup finely chopped carrots
2 tbsps. mayonnaise	2 tbsps. chopped pimiento stuffed green olives
1 tbs sweet pickle relish	lettuce leaves, and/or tomato slices, optional
4 hard-cooked eggs, chopped	

In a medium sized bowl, stir together first 3 ingredients. Stir in remaining ingredients until evenly coated with dressing. Cover and chill to blend flavors. Serve on lettuce leaves and garish with tomato slices, if desired.

Salad Nicoise

Boston or Romaine lettuce	8 hard cooked eggs, sliced
9 oz. pkg. frozen Italian green beans	1/4 cup sliced black olives
4 medium potatoes	Bottled Italian dressing
4 medium tomatoes	

Cook and drain green beans. Cook, peel and thinly slice potatoes. Slice tomatoes. Arrange lettuce leaves on 4 salad plates. Mound about 1/2 cup beans in the center of each. Arrange potato, tomato, and egg slices in petal fashion around beans. Sprinkle each salad with about 1 tablespoon olive slices. Serve with dressing.

Honey Bun French Toast

6 eggs	1 tbsp. cinnamon
2 cups fat-free half and half	1 cup chopped pecans
2 tps. vanilla	12 slices loaf bread
1/3 cup sugar	1/2 cup powdered sugar
1 cup dark brown sugar	1 tbsp. milk

In a medium sized bowl beat together eggs, half and half, vanilla and sugar; set aside. Mix together in a small bowl brown sugar and cinnamon. Spray a 9 x 17-inch baking dish with vegetable spray and place 6 slices of bread in bottom of casserole dish. Sprinkle with half of brown sugar mixture and top with half of pecans. Pour half of egg batter mixture over bread, pressing liquid into bread slices. Place remaining bread slices on top and repeat layers. Press liquid into bread slices to make sure all edges are covered. Refrigerate overnight. Bake in a 350 F oven for 40-45 minutes or until French Toast is puffy. In a small bowl combine powdered sugar and milk; using a wire whisk beat until smooth. Drizzle glaze randomly over top of toast. Yield: 6 servings.

Bacon Onion Quiche Bites

30 mini fillo shells, 1 1/2 inch diameter	2 tbsps. real bacon bits
3 eggs	1 tsp. dried minced onion
1/3 cup fat-free half and half	Fresh chives for garnish, optional
3/4 cup shredded Cheddar cheese	

Place fillo shells on baking sheet. In a mixing bowl, beat together eggs, half and half, cheese, bacon bits and onion. Spoon 2 teaspoons of filling into each fillo shell. Bake at 375°F until quiches puff and turn slightly brown or about 15-20 minutes. Garnish with fresh chives, if desired.

Broccoli & Cheese Quiche

1 cup small broccoli florets	1/4 tsp. freshly ground pepper
2 sliced mushrooms	1/8 tsp. freshly grated nutmeg
3 green onions, thinly sliced	1 cup Monterey Jack cheese
4 eggs	1 cup cheddar cheese
1 1/2 cups milk	1 frozen pie crust, thawed
1/4 tsp. salt	

Cook the pie crust according to directions on package. Adjust oven temperature to 325 F. Bring a saucepan 3/4 full lightly salted water to a boil. Add the broccoli and cook until tender-crisp, about 5 minutes. Drain well, pat dry and set aside. In a bowl using a fork, beat the eggs until lightly frothy. Stir in green onions, milk, salt, pepper, and nutmeg. Scatter the broccoli evenly in the cooked pastry shell. Drop small clumps of the cheese evenly among the florets. Carefully pour in the egg mixture. Bake until a knife inserted into the center comes out clean, about 60 minutes. Transfer to a rack to cool for 15 minutes. Serve warm.

Pound Cake

2 sticks unsalted sweet cream butter	3 cups cake flour
3 cups sugar	1 pint whipping cream
6 eggs	1 tsp vanilla

Soften butter in microwave for a few seconds (do not melt). In a large bowl, mix sugar and butter. Add eggs one at a time. Beat well after each. Add flour and whipping cream. Beat well. Add vanilla. Beat well. Bake in greased cake pan for 1 1/2 hours at 275 degrees. Top with fresh Louisiana strawberries!

Natural history tells us that ancient forest fires that were started by natural means, like lightning, were essential for the creation of the vast southern longleaf pine forest.

Fires squelched hardwood and woody shrub competition to sustain the diverse longleaf pine ecosystem that included red-cockaded woodpeckers, gopher tortoises and precious rare plants like the carnivorous pitcher plant.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) District 6 Manager Kirk Casanova says longleaf pine forests, which once covered much of southeast U.S., have been on the decline for more than a century. The decline, Casanova said, is due in part to the preference of the timber industry for the slash and loblolly pine trees.

"The longleaf pine can be more difficult to establish, but landowners are having great success with containerized longleaf seedlings which have increased survival rates," Casanova said.

Recently, the longleaf pine has experienced a renaissance of sorts brought on by government incentive programs like the U.S. Natural Resources Conservation Service's (NRCS) Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP). The incentive program entices landowners interested in conservation by providing technical assistance and 75 percent cost-share assistance to establish and improve wildlife habitats.

One Louisiana landowner, Beryl Trawick,

is taking advantage of the conservation assistance through WHIP to establish longleaf pine stands on her property in Tangipahoa Parish.

Not only are LDAF forestry fire crews using prescription burning to reduce the build up of undesirable vegetation like dead leaves and wood, but also for longleaf pine forest management. Crews conducted a prescribed burn on Trawick's young longleaf pine tract located south of Highway 22 near Ponchatoula in Tangipahoa Parish.

"Ms. Beryl Trawick has been trying to establish this field for some time," Casanova said.

The stately longleaf tree's lifespan can reach beyond 250 years and it undergoes quite a metamorphosis throughout its existence, according to the Longleaf Alliance.

The Longleaf Alliance is a group of ecologists, foresters, wildlife biologists, landowners and land managers who promote the restoration of the longleaf pine ecosystem.

The longleaf begins life like any other tree in the seed stage. At this point in its life cycle, the longleaf is most vulnerable to fire.

As it grows, it evolves into something that looks more like a tuft of grass than a tree, but this young tree is resilient to fire during the grass stage.

"Longleaf pine trees can stay in the grass stage for eight to twelve years unless you prescribe burn to help it jump out of this stage," Casanova said. "A fire can burn all

the needles off but it won't kill the tree."

When the longleaf enters the bottle brush stage, the tree stands around three to four feet high. During this stage the longleaf may have no limbs or needles and only display a bushy top with a white fluffy growing tip called a candle in the center.

Casanova said land managers must be careful with prescribed burns at this stage. "If the candle is way up high and you put too much heat on it you can kill the tree," He said.

At the sapling stage, the trees are between six to 10 feet tall and begin to sprout lateral branches. Once the longleaf reaches eight feet in height and at least two-inches in diameter, they are hardy and rarely killed by fire.

At maturity, around 30-years-old and between 60-110 feet tall depending on soil quality, longleaf pines begin producing pinecones and seeds. The final life stages of the longleaf are old growth and death stages.

Trawick's interest in the species began long before the recent resurgence of the longleaf.

"When we began planting longleaf we couldn't get any help," Trawick said. "In fact, all we got was discouragement. They said, 'you can't grow longleaf in that ol' wet clay.'"

Now with support from government programs like WHIP, conservation-minded landowners can get help to restore or establish wildlife habitats like longleaf pine

forests.

"Now there is so much help through the WHIP program because they pay for a percentage of site prep, cost of the seedlings, planting and chemical treatment," Trawick said. "The challenge with getting the longleaf back is the soil. Down here the soil is so rich, the competition will block the longleaf, but once you get it established you're okay."

Trawick believes longleaf pine trees offer more than just valuable timber.

"There is a whole ecosystem wrapped with it. You get the fox squirrels, we even have a gopher tortoise, wild turkeys...all these things that are native to this area do so much better in a longleaf fire regime," Trawick said. "They are also wind, drought, fire and insect resistant and have a better quality timber than some of the other pines."

Trawick said she is delighted the LDAF now sells containerized longleaf seedlings. "It is much, much easier to plant and grow."

2009-2010 was the first time LDAF nurseries grew and sold containerized tree seedlings.

The LDAF produces and sells both pine and hardwood seedlings at its nurseries in Columbia, DeRidder and Monroe. Orders may be submitted beginning July 1 and will be filled between December 15 and March 1. For additional information on tree seedlings, visit www.LDAF.la.gov or call 225-925-4515.
