





Ag Emergency Response Team conducts training exercise

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the state's Agricultural Emergency Response Team (AgERT) participated in a multi-state practice emergency response exercise to combat a fictional veterinary emergency and fulfilled its mission.

"I'm very pleased with the professionalism of our team and the efficacy of their training," Strain said. "The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) is one of the few state agencies whose personnel have completed the National Incident Management Systems training and this training exercise gives them much needed experience if an actual emergency were to occur."

The exercise pitted Louisiana responders against a simulated foreign animal disease that had the potential to seriously disrupt the

Louisiana, Alabama and Mississippi cattle population. Alabama and Mississippi state agriculture officials were conducting the same exercise as part of a larger training session that invoked the Southern Agriculture and Animal Disaster Response Alliance (SAADRA).

The training took place at LDAF headquarters April 29-30 in Baton Rouge.

Participants in the Baton Rouge exercise included officials from the USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service Veterinary Service, LSU AgCenter, Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals, Texas Animal Health Commission, Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission and private industry observers.

"The National Incident Management System provides a framework for first responders to


assess a situation and report to higher authorities up the line to create an efficient response to anything from small emergencies like a 100-acre forest fire to larger multi-state hurricane disasters," Strain said.

The exercise was a two-day training which gave the AgERT incident command staff an opportunity to develop a plan to contain the fictional veterinary emergency. The scenario involved a second day of training when veterinary materials requested from the National Veterinary Stockpile were delivered to a LDAF warehouse

Technicians learned how to receive, inventory and deliver the palletized veterinary supplies to emergency responders in the field.

"Our overall mission is to protect the human, animal and plant health of the state," Strain said. "This training is another way to achieve that goal."

Federal program addresses veterinarian shortage

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the United States Department of Agriculture's National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) is accepting applications from veterinarians wishing to participate in the Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program (VMLRP).

The program addresses veterinary shortages in rural America by repaying the student loans of qualified veterinarians in return for their services in areas suffering from a lack of veterinarians. In return for a commitment of three years of veterinary services in a designated veterinary shortage area, NIFA may repay up to \$25,000 of student loan

debt per year.

"I know first hand that there are areas in Louisiana and the country that are underserved when it comes to veterinary care," Strain said. "I think this program will help get trained veterinarians where they are most needed."

USDA Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack announced the program on April 30.

"The lack of adequate veterinary services, especially in the area of food animal medicine, creates hardships for producers and endangers livestock throughout rural America," said Vilsack. "This program will help alleviate the shortage of trained professional veterinarians that serve our producers,

improving the health of the livestock industry and helping ensure a safe food supply."

More than 150 U.S. locations were identified as having a critical shortage of food animal veterinarians. Parishes in Louisiana designated with a food animal veterinary care shortage were St. Helena, Tangipahoa, Washington, Jackson, Lincoln, Ouachita, Richland, West Carroll, East Carroll, Terrebonne, Lafourche, Plaquemines, Natchitoches, Sabine and Vernon.

"We need more veterinarians in these areas to help our food animal producers," Strain said. "Veterinary care is essential for the national food safety and food security infrastructures as well as the health and

well-being of animals and humans."

Major studies indicate significant and growing shortage of food supply veterinarians and veterinarians serving in certain other high priority specialty areas. A leading cause for this shortage is the heavy cost of four years of professional veterinary medical training, which can average between \$130,000 and \$140,000. Congress established the VMLRP as a way to remedy this growing need.

The deadline to apply for the VMLRP is June 30. Offers of acceptance will be made by Sept. 30. Application forms can be found on the NIFA website at www.nifa.usda.gov.

LDAF, LDWF staging assets for wildlife rescue/rehabilitation effort

The Louisiana Departments of Agriculture (LDAF) and Forestry and Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF) are bringing assets into the recovery zone to support the mission of biologists and rehab specialists as they work to save oiled bird species and mammals.

Resources have been positioned in Plaquemines Parish to accommodate the anticipated need for wildlife rescue and rehabilitation efforts as oil moves into coastal marshes along the Louisiana coast.

"We are partnering again with Ag and Forestry to respond to a disaster of a different kind," said LDWF Secretary Robert Barham. "Dr. Strain has worked with us closely in hurricane response missions and the close partnership is at work once again."

Agriculture and Forestry

Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said LDAF provided 3,000 animal crates to Plaquemines Parish for use in the response effort to the Deepwater

Horizon oil spill. The crates will house shorebirds, migratory birds and various mammals impacted by the oil spill. Those assets were delivered to LDWF officials on Thursday, May 6.

Reports on wildlife affected by the oil totaled

four birds being treated at the Fort Jackson rehabilitation center in Buras. Two birds were reported dead as of mid day, Friday, May 7.

LDWF biologists, along with biologists from federal and contracted recovery specialists, are making daily trips into oil impacted marshland areas to recover distressed wildlife.

"The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry stands ready to assist in the oil spill response in any way," Strain said.

The crates were previously used for pet evacuation during hurricanes Gustav and Ike.

The crates were shipped from an animal evacuation facility at Dixon Correctional Institute near Zachary and the Central Louisiana State Hospital in Pineville.

The LDAF is monitoring the oil spill's movement and studying the possible impact to domestic animals and agriculture.



Incredible Egg Recipes

Broccoli-Cheddar Frittata

1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen chopped broccoli	2 tsp. prepared mustard
1 small carrot, diced	1 tsp. seasoned salt
1/4 cup water	1/8 tsp. pepper
8 EGGS	3/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese
1/4 cup milk	1 tbsp. chopped green onion

Combine broccoli, carrot, if desired, and water in 10-inch nonstick skillet. Cook over medium heat until tender, stirring occasionally to break up broccoli, about 10 minutes; drain well. Beat eggs, milk, mustard, salt and pepper in large bowl until blended. Add broccoli mixture, cheese and green onion; mix well. Coat same skillet with cooking spray; heat over medium heat until hot. Pour in egg mixture; cook over low to medium heat until eggs are almost set, 8 to 10 minutes. Remove from heat. Cover and let stand until eggs are completely set and no visible liquid egg remains, 8 to 10 minutes. Cut into wedges.

Ham & Eggs In Puff Pastry

2 EGGS, well beaten	4 hard-cooked eggs, chopped
1 tbsp. prepared mustard	1 cup chopped ham
2 tsp. lemon juice	1/2 cup shredded Swiss cheese
1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen chopped spinach, defrosted, squeezed dry	1 sheet frozen puff pastry, defrosted

Heat oven to 425 degrees. Reserve 2 tbsp. beaten egg for glazing. Mix remaining beaten eggs, mustard and lemon juice in large bowl. Add spinach; mix well. Add hard-cooked eggs, ham and cheese; mix gently. Roll puff pastry on lightly floured surface into 15 x 9-inch rectangle. Brush lightly with some of the reserved beaten egg. Spoon spinach mixture lengthwise down center of pastry. Fold sides of pastry over filling, pinching edges together in center to seal; pinch short ends of pastry to seal. Place, seam-side-down, on lightly greased baking sheet. Brush top and sides with remaining beaten egg. Cut 5 diagonal slashes across top of pastry for steam vents. Bake in a 425 degree oven until pastry is golden brown and filling is heated through, about 20 minutes. Cut crosswise into 1-inch slices.

Bananas Foster Cheese Pie - part 1

1 9-inch graham cracker crust	CREAM CHEESE LAYER:
BANANA LAYER:	2 pkgs. (8 oz. each) cream cheese, room temperature
2 tbsp. butter	6 EGGS, room temperature
2-1/2 cups sliced bananas (1/4-inch)	1 cup sugar
1/4 cup sugar	1-1/2 tbsp. fresh lemon juice
1-1/2 tbsp. fresh lemon juice	1-1/2 tsp. vanilla
1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice	1/3 cup all-purpose flour

Bacon & Egg Breakfast Grilled Cheese

2 EGGS	4 slices whole wheat or white bread
2 tbsp. milk or water	
Salt and pepper	2 slices Co-Jack cheese
3 tsp. butter, room temp., divided	4 slices fully-cooked bacon

Beat eggs, milk, salt and pepper in bowl until blended. Heat 1 tsp. butter in large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Pour in egg mixture. As eggs begin to set, gently pull the eggs across the pan with an inverted turner, forming large soft curds. Continue cooking – pulling, lifting and folding eggs – until thickened and no visible liquid egg remains. Do not stir constantly. Remove from pan. Clean skillet. Spread remaining 2 tsp. butter evenly on one side of each bread slice. Place 2 slices in skillet, buttered side down. Top evenly with scrambled eggs, cheese and bacon. Cover with remaining bread, buttered side up. Grill sandwiches over medium heat, turning once, until bread is toasted and cheese is melted, 2 to 4 minutes.

Hash Brown-Crusted Mediterranean Quiche

3-1/2 cups frozen shredded hash brown potatoes	1 cup chopped drained oil-packed artichoke hearts
1 tbsp. butter	4 EGGS
1 cup chopped onion	1/2 cup milk
1 large clove garlic, minced	1/2 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
1 small zucchini, quartered, thinly sliced	1/2 tsp. dried basil leaves
1 cup diced red bell pepper	1/2 tsp. dried oregano leaves
	2 cups marinara sauce, warmed

Heat oven to 425 degrees. Press potatoes evenly on bottom and sides of greased 10-inch quiche dish or pie plate. Coat lightly with cooking spray. Bake in 425 degree oven until potatoes are lightly browned and crisp, about 30 minutes. Then lower oven to 375 degrees. Heat butter in large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add onion and garlic; sauté until tender, 3 to 4 minutes. Add zucchini, bell pepper and artichokes; sauté until crisp-tender. Beat eggs, milk, cheese, basil and oregano in large bowl until blended. Add zucchini mixture; mix well. Pour into potato crust. Bake in center of 375 degree oven until knife inserted near center comes out clean, about 45 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes. Cut into wedges; serve with marinara sauce.

Bananas Foster Cheese Pie - part 2

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Banana layer: heat butter in large nonstick skillet over medium heat. Add bananas; cook, stirring gently, until soft, about 2 minutes. Do not mash. Add sugar, lemon juice and pie spice. Cook, stirring gently, until mixture thickens, 1 to 1-1/2 minutes. Spread evenly in bottom of crumb crust. Cream cheese layer: Combine cream cheese, eggs, sugar, lemon juice and vanilla in mixer bowl. Beat on high speed until well blended. Reduce speed to low. Beat in flour just until blended and no streaks of flour remain. Pour over banana mixture. Carefully, place pie on rack in center of 350 degree oven. Bake until knife inserted midway between center and edge of pie comes out clean, 40 to 45 minutes. Cool completely on wire rack. Refrigerate, loosely covered, until firm, several hours or overnight.

Tomato blight threatening south Louisiana gardens

Scientists at the LSU AgCenter recently confirmed the presence of late blight on tomatoes in home gardens in Terrebonne, Lafayette, Livingston and Tangipahoa parishes. Symptoms include black lesions on stems and petioles, blackening of the fruit, and dark, dead areas on the foliage.

"The disease is probably being introduced on infected transplants, so be sure to check tomato plants for symptoms before you buy them," said LSU AgCenter plant pathologist Don Ferrin.

Experts across the state are working to remedy this situation as quickly as they can, Ferrin said.

"I recommend that home gardeners remove and destroy any infected plants," he said. "Additionally, as a preventative measure, I suggest they spray their plants on a regular basis with fungicides such as chlorothalonil, mancozeb, copper or a combination of mancozeb plus copper."

When using the mixture of mancozeb and copper, allow it to sit for about 30 minutes before spraying and stir it frequently, he said, noting that chlorothalonil may be used up to and including the day of harvest, whereas mancozeb cannot be used within five days of harvest.

"Because these fungicides are protectants only, thorough spray

coverage is essential for control," Ferrin said.

"A number of fungicides are available at garden centers," he said. "Be sure to read the label carefully to be sure the product is intended for use on tomatoes, and apply the material carefully according to label directions.

"Late blight also occurs on Irish potatoes, so home gardeners may also want to spray them as a preventative measure," Ferrin said. "Fungicide use rates for tomatoes may not be the same for Irish potatoes, so be sure to check the label.

"With any luck, the warm weather that we're now experiencing will slow disease development," he added.

Church Point producer appointed to Beef Board

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said Louisiana beef producer Genevieve Lyons was appointed to a three-year term on the Cattlemen's Beef Promotion and Research Board by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack.

The Beef Board oversees administration of the national Beef Checkoff Program, Strain said.

Lyons, of Church Point, Acadia Parish, participated in new-member orientation in Denver in April and will

be seated for her first meeting of the full Beef Board at the Cattle Industry Summer Conference in Denver on July 31. She is one of 106 producers and importers nationwide representing all cattlemen. The board makes recommendations about investing the national beef checkoff dollars.

Together with her husband, Daniel, Lyons owns and operates a cow/calf operation and farm of more than 1,800 acres. They also raise quarterhorses, provide custom hay baling, and run a commercial hay business. Lyons has been recognized and honored by numerous organizations at the local, state and national level.

"We're proud that the board recognized one of our Louisiana cattle producers," Strain said. "Genevieve is a tireless promoter of the cattle industry in the state. She will now bring her energy to the national level."

The mission of the Cattlemen's Beef Board is to build demand for beef by promotion, research and informational programs through the national Beef Checkoff Program.

During the April orientation meeting in Denver, Lyons and other new Beef Board members learned about their voluntary role for the next three years. The work will include prioritizing strategies aimed at leveraging beef producers' checkoff

dollars. They'll also study the research, educational and promotional efforts that offer the biggest return on producers' investments and make annual recommendations for checkoff funding of specific programs.

The Beef Checkoff Program was established as part of the 1985 Farm Bill. The checkoff assesses \$1 per head on the sale of live domestic and imported cattle, in addition to a comparable assessment on imported beef and beef products. States retain up to 50 cents on the dollar and forward the other 50 cents per head to the Cattlemen's Beef Promotion and Research Board, which administers the national checkoff program, subject to USDA approval.

Louisiana crawfish crop unaffected by gulf oil spill

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said crawfish is a freshwater seafood and will not be affected by the Deepwater Horizon oil spill.

"We want to let everyone know that the Louisiana crawfish season is in full swing and crawfish should be plentiful through the end of June," Strain said. "Plan your corporate and backyard crawfish boils. Invite your friends over for an étouffée dinner. Our Louisiana crawfish producers will continue to fish to supply the state and national demand."

LSU AgCenter Aquaculture Professor Robert Romaine said crawfish production areas are located inland and far away from any possible impact from the oil spill.

"Crawfish are raised in freshwater ponds

and the Atchafalaya Basin," Romaine said. "There are no crawfish ponds sufficiently close to the coast that can be impacted by the oil spill."

Romaine said LSU AgCenter statistics from the past decade show a large percentage of the crawfish crop is harvested from ponds.

"More than 98 million pounds of crawfish came from domestic ponds in 2009," Romaine said. "The wild crawfish crop accounted for nearly 15.5 million pounds."

The gross farm value of the 2009 crop was \$125 million.

Crawfish farmer David Savoy of Acadia Parish said, "Some farmers are pumping water from their wells into the ponds because it's been so dry lately. Crawfish are moving pretty well right

now but it's important to maintain good water quality." The water is pumped from fresh water wells that tap the Chicot

Aquifer.

Savoy is a member of the Louisiana Crawfish Promotion and Research Board and president of the Louisiana Crawfish Farmers Association.

"We're plenty far away from the oil spill and there's no danger that our crawfish ponds will be affected," Savoy said.

Jody Meche, an Atchafalaya Basin crawfisherman from St. Martin Parish said "As long as there's a current coming down the Atchafalaya River, there's no chance that the oil spill could affect our catch. There is no way the oil is going to travel up to our fishing areas."

Meche is a member of the Louisiana Crawfish Promotion and Research Board and vice president of Louisiana Crawfish Producers-West.
