a good cattleman

The highest goal any cattleman could ever want to attain is to be known as a good cattleman. "He took care of his cattle," is the best compliment one cattleman can give to another.

By all accounts, West Monroe cattleman Robert Joyner is a good cattleman.

But Joyner is so much more than a good cattleman. He's a family man, been married to the same woman for more than 25 years, and has four children. He's hardworking. Counting his cattle raising duties, the 59-year-old Ouachita Parish native has held two jobs for most of his life. He spent 30 years hardwiring buildings for electricity, but he's spent 40 years taking care of his Braford, Hereford and Angus herd.

Joyner will tell you raising cattle is not a job; it's a calling.

"I have a passion for it," Joyner said. "I guess it has to be born in you. You've got to be willing to go out in the freezing cold to feed your cattle."

Joyner was willing to do a lot of things to be in the cattle business. He spent two years of his early adult life in the saddle riding the pastures of a large cattle outfit in Union Parish.

"It was real cowboy work," Joyner said. "We stayed on the horse. Every morning, when everybody else

was getting ready for work, we were already out riding the drop pasture."

Riding range was appealing to the outdoorsman in Joyner but he soon opted for an electrician's job. He reckoned electrical work was a bit more stable for a family man than cowboy work. Still, during his career as an electrician, Joyner always kept a herd of cattle.

"My dad helped me get started and we were in business together," Joyner said. "I built my herd with my dad's help."

It's because of his enthusiasm for the cow business that Joyner was tapped as the executive vice president of the Louisiana Cattlemen's Association (LCA) two years ago.

The Louisiana Cattlemen's Association is the primary voice for the state's cattlemen, Joyner said. The group lobbies for the cattle and beef industry on the local and state levels.

"I lobby at the district, parish and state levels," Joyner said. "I was always active in my local cattlemen's association."

Lobbying is important, Joyner said, but the group is much more than a political organization. Joyner attributes his success in the cattle business to the

Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

USDA conservation stewardship program deadline is Jan. 7

The first deadline is Jan. 7 to sign up for the United States Department of Agriculture's Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) for eligible forest landowners and managers to receive financial and technical assistance for soil, water, air, and related natural resources conservation and enhancement on their land, Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said.

"It's a great program for all non-industrial private forest landowners and managers because it's good for the land and for the forest producer," Strain said.

State Conservationist Kevin Norton of the Natural Resources Conservation Service said approved forest landowners and managers received an average payment of \$13

per acre, per year, for five-year CSP contracts last year.

"The program enabled them to implement conservation practices that had a direct impact on local soil and water quality," Norton said.

Administered by the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), CSP offers assistance to private non-industrial forest landowners and managers to undertake new conservation activities or improve, maintain, or manage existing conservation activities.

The resulting conservation benefits include improvement of water and soil quality, wildlife habitat enhancement, and implementation of conservation activities that address the effects of climate change.

An eligible CSP applicant must have a Farm Service Agency (FSA)

farm and tract number to participate and be listed as the operator of the farm with FSA or be eligible for a waiver. CSP contracts are for five years, and the enhancement(s) selected by the landowner or manager will be implemented during the contract period.

Norton said there are more than 23 enhancements a forest landowner or manager may choose to enhance their woodlands. Selecting a combination of enhancements may increase potential ranking and dollars per acre/per year payment rates for eligible producers.

Examples of possible enhancements include managing forest buffers along creeks, creating snags, preparing sites with high fuel loads for prescribed burning by fuel chipping, prescribed burning, conifer or

hardwood crop tree release, and establishing pollinator habitat on log sets and forest openings.

Approved beginning farmers or socially disadvantaged farmers who have at least 20 contiguous acres of eligible land may also apply. These farmers will be eligible for a minimum payment of \$1,000 per year for five years for implementing at least one CSP enhancement.

Strain said the Conservation Stewardship Program is not just for forest landowners and managers.

"Other eligible lands include cropland, grassland, prairie land, improved pastureland, rangeland, and agricultural land under the jurisdiction of an Indian tribe," Strain said. "There are a lot of different ways for landowners to take advantage of this program."

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

Fried Mushrooms

1 pound mushrooms	1 ½ tps. salt
Juice of 1 lemon	¼ tsp. pepper
3 eggs	1 ½ - 2 cups bread crumbs
½ cup or more flour	Cooking oil

Place washed mushrooms in bowl of cold water and lemon juice. Let stand for 5 minutes. Remove and dry with paper towels. Beat eggs, adding flour gradually to make thick batter. Add seasonings. Cut mushrooms into bite sized pieces. Dip into batter and then into bread crumbs. Fry until golden brown.

Cheese Straws

1 (10 oz.) pkg. piecrust mix	2 egg yolks
1 cup grated sharp Cheddar cheese	Milk
¼ teaspoon curry powder	Paprika or sesame seeds

Combine piecrust mix with cheese and curry powder. Add egg yolks and mix with fork. (If dough is too stiff, add a little milk with fork to combine.) Roll out on floured board to 1/8 inch thickness. Sprinkle lightly with paprika, or brush with milk and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Cut into a 3"x ½" strips. Bake on greased cookie sheet in preheated 425 degrees oven 8-10 minutes. Cool on a rack. Serve hot or cold.

Pecan Cheesecake Pie

1 refrigerated piecrust	2 tps. vanilla extract
1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened	¼ tsp. salt
4 large eggs	1- ¼ cups chopped pecans
¾ cup sugar	1 cup light corn syrup

Fit piecrust into 9 inch pie plate according to directions. Crimp edges. Beat cream cheese, 1 egg, ½ cup sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla, and salt at medium speed with an electric mixer until smooth. Pour cream cheese mixture into piecrust; sprinkle evenly with pecans. Whisk together corn syrup and remaining 3 eggs, ¼ cup sugar and 1 teaspoon vanilla; pour mixture over pecans. Place pie on a baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees on lowest rack 50 to 55 minutes or until pie is set. Cool on a wire rack 1 hour or until cool.

Apple Pecan Cake

3 cups self-rising flour	3 cups pecans, chopped
3 apples pared and diced	1 -½ cups Crisco oil
1 tsp. cinnamon	2 eggs
1 tsp. vanilla	2 cups sugar

Mix together. Pour into Bundt pan. Bake in a preheated 275 degrees for 2 hours.

Cocktail Crawfish Turnovers part I


1 tbsp. unsalted butter	2 tbsps. all-purpose flour
¼ cup onions, chopped	¾ cup whole milk
2 tbsps. green bell peppers, chopped	½ lb. peeled Louisiana crawfish tails
2 tbsps. celery, chopped	¼ cup grated Pepper Jack cheese
1 ½ tps. season all	2 tbsps. green onions, chopped
¼ tsp. salt	2 tps. fresh parsley, chopped
1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper	1 pkg. (2 sheets) frozen puff pastry, thawed in the refrigerator
½ tsp. garlic, chopped	2 egg yolks, beaten with 2 teaspoons water

Cocktail Crawfish Turnovers part II

Heat butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add onions, bell peppers and celery. Season with season all and cayenne, stirring until the onion is soft, about 2 minutes. Add garlic, stirring about 30 seconds. Add flour, stirring until the mixture is lightly golden, about 3 minutes. Add milk and continue stirring until the mixture is smooth and thick, about 3 minutes. Remove from heat. Add crawfish tails, cheese, green onions, and parsley. Remove from heat and let cool to room temperature.

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees. Roll out each pastry sheet to 12x15 inches on a lightly floured surface. Trim the edges to make them even. With a sharp knife, cut each sheet into 20, 3 inch squares. Mound about 2 teaspoons of the crawfish mixture in the center of each square, brush 2 edges of the squares with the egg wash, fold over diagonally and seal. Crimp the edges with a fork. Lightly brush the tops of the turnovers with some of the egg wash. Using the tip of a paring knife, make a tiny slit in the top of each turnover so that steam can escape during baking.

Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil or parchment paper. Place turnovers about an inch apart on the sheet and bake until golden, 12-15 minutes. Remove from the oven and let cool for 5 minutes before serving.

Joyner maintains a herd of Braford, Herford and Angus cattle in Ouachita Parish.

"The biggest thing that helped me as a cattleman was being in the Cattlemen's Association," Joyner said. "The Beef Quality Assurance program and the Master Cattleman program will teach you more than anything how to handle your herd to be profitable. It's helped me personally more than anything."

With a little more than 3,000 members statewide, Joyner said the LCA is growing.

"We've been getting more calls about cattle than ever before," Joyner said. "People just want to make sure they're doing the right thing with their money when it comes to cattle."

Because of his duties as the executive officer for the LCA, Joyner is traveling the state daily attending meetings and helping other cattlemen. His time to work his own herd is limited so Joyner's son, Jason, and grandson, Zack, have picked up the slack in handling

the Joyner herd.

"I wouldn't be able to do this work with the LCA if it weren't for my son and grandson," Joyner said.

Getting family involved is key to preserving the cattle-raising traditions of Louisiana, Joyner said. It's also one of his personal goals for the LCA.

"The biggest thing I'd like to do is get more young people involved in the business," Joyner said. "I'd like them to take

over their fathers' and grandfathers' businesses.

"The best thing cattlemen can do is to show your children what it's all about, but I've seen kids that never had an ag background in their life have a passion for raising cattle.

"You can make money in the cattle business and you can lose, but I've seen people build a home on a few cows. You've got to manage it with the right practices, right genetics and the right feed."

He admits it's a bit more complicated to enter into today's cattle market. Gone are the days when all you needed was some barbed wire, a tractor and a horse.

"I have seven tractors," Joyner said. "My wife wants to know why a grown man needs seven tractors."

Joyner still has horses but he prefers to get around his ranch on a Gator 4-wheeler.

"It's a lot easier to start up a Gator than it is to saddle up a horse," he said. "But there's still some places a horse can go where the Gator can't."

Another goal for Joyner is to help other cattlemen.

"I want cattlemen to get the new technologies and be more involved with the advancements in the industry," Joyner said.

Joyner knows helping his fellow cattleman is an important goal but there's a part of him that longs to be out in the pasture. Would he rather be out in the dark on an ice cold night helping a mamma cow birth a calf? You bet.

"I'd rather be in the pasture any day," Joyner said. "A cattleman sees nature in a different way than someone in a metropolitan area. He sees nature bloom. He also sees the hard side, but with all those hard things, in the spring, you got all the baby calves. You got to take time to smell those roses too."
