



Louisiana Agriculture & Forestry Today

LDAF competition nets 750 pounds of donations for BR Food Bank

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said a friendly race challenge between Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry accountant Lauren Robillard and State Forester Wade Dubea netted more than 750 pounds of food for the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank today.

Robillard, a slim 20-something, challenged Dubea, a somewhat less slim 40-something, to an arduous "pack test." Successful completion of the pack test is a necessary requirement for U.S. Forestry Service wildland firefight-

Wildland firefighters must be able to complete the pack test by wearing a special 45-pound training vest and finish a three-mile hike within 45 minutes.

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry employees were allowed to watch the spectacle by contributing food items like canned goods to the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank.

A 17-lap course was set up in the front parking lot of the LDAF building on Florida Boulevard and Robillard and Dubea Robillard and Dubea surprised the cheering crowd by clasping hands and crossing the finish line together in 42 minutes and 34 seconds.

Strain was the official starter and the racing stewards were Forestry Protection Chief Don Smith and Asst. Protection Chief Bret Lane.

Wildland Firefighter Mike Smith, dressed in full wildland firefighting gear, demonstrated various firefighting hand tools like combi-tools and fire rakes used by all wildland firefighters in the field.

"It was a fun event and we're glad to have had this opportunity to raise awareness, not only for the Baton Rouge Food Bank, but also our wildland firefighters," Strain said. "Our crew members do a great job of protecting Louisiana's forests."

So far in 2011, LDAF wildland firefighting crews have suppressed 1,117 wildland fires that have damaged more then 13,000 acres.

Erin Swenson, vice president of communications for the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank was thrilled with the

"What a great way to bring public awareness to the issue of hunger in our community," Swenson said. "Of course we are very grateful to the Department of Agriculture and Forestry and its staff for participating in this food drive and it looked like they had a great time doing it."



from Walter

Retired rice farmer Gilford Domingue of Crowley called the Market Bulletin and told us he had a chicken that laid a big egg. Folks wouldn't regularly call us about the size of a chicken egg unless they had something to really crow about (pun very much intended). Domingue has a small flock of Australorps, Rhode Island reds and white leggings.

The Market Bulletin decided to visit Domingue at his home south of Crowley but we wanted to make sure it was worth our while to drive out to Acadia Parish.

"It measures seven and quarter inches in circumference," Domingue said.

That was big enough for me.

With LDAF Poultry and Egg Inspector Brandon Fairburn in tow, the Market Bulletin set out for Crowley. We met Lance Castille, an LDAF Agro-Consumer Inspector, at a supermarket parking lot and headed off to the Domingue farm.

LDAF egg inspectors usually inspect facilities at commercial egg producer farms, retail outlets and anywhere eggs are sold. They look for sanitation, grading and quality. Fairburn wasn't inspecting Domingue's farm. He just wanted to see a big ol' egg, but the Market Bulletin did want Castille to come along to weigh the egg. One of the many duties of an

Agro-Consumer Inspector is to check commercial weight scales for accuracy. The Market Bulletin wanted to get the most accurate weight as possible of the egg of interest.

It turned out that Domingue's egg weighed in at 4.02 ounces. Domingue said he found a record of an egg from Iowa that tipped the scale at 4.2 ounces.

Not that the LDAF is the repository of the "World's Largest Anything Agricultural," but the Domingue egg is pretty big. The biggest we'd ever seen. By the numbers, Domingue's egg weighs 113.5 grams. A normal sized jumbo-grade egg weighs 69 grams. Domingue's four-ounce egg is a quarter-pounder, more than twice the size of a regular

And the egg came from a normal sized Australorp hen.

Domingue said he would not make an omelet with his egg.

"I don't think I'm ever going to crack that egg," he said.

Next up was the white donkey that resided at a small farm outside of Walker and is owned by Arthur Ebey Sr., a part-time funeral service driver.

Ebey said the donkey, named Snowball (what else?), was only the second white donkey he had seen in his 75 years.

Snowball was what the Bible would refer to as a white "ass,"

Ebey said. Ebey should know. He's also a preacher.

White equine doesn't seem unusual for an equine, does it?

The answer is yes, white equines, horse or donkey, are extremely rare.

"The only true white in horses is a genetic mutation that creates lethal white syndrome and as the name suggests, is lethal," said Neely Heidorn, Ph.D., an equine specialist with the LSU AgCenter. "The foals with lethal white syndrome typically die within days of being born."

Heidorn said the "white" horses we see are actually grey and are characterized with black skin and dark eyes.

Heidorn said a true white donkey survives birth. They are not as rare as hen's teeth, but rare just the same. A true white donkey has white hair, pink skin and dark eyes. She's seen a lot in the way of horses but she's never seen a true white donkey.

Ebey had Snowball tied with a rope to an antique tractor parked in his front yard. Snowball was a little shy and nervous. Lead ropes and bridles were new to him.

"I had to have my grandson go out and catch him because I hadn't fooled with him too much," Ebey said. "I preach, play bluegrass music and drive for a funeral home, you know."

Snowball was, as they say, pure

as the driven snow.

Heidorn examined the donkey. White hair? Check? Pink skin? Check. Dark eyes? Check. They were dark blue, as blue as an azure sky of deepest summer.

There was one speck of black pepper in the white beans, however. Snowball wasn't quite white all over. He had a few dark gray spots on his nose.

In the end, Heidorn classified Snowball as a "frosted spotted white ass."

Heidorn wasn't discouraged. "A


frosted spotted white is still unusual," Heidorn said.

Ebey likes to plow his garden the old-fashioned way, that is, with a horse (or donkey)-drawn plow.

"My daddy wouldn't allow a tractor in his field," the 75-year-old Ebey said. "I'm going to work with Snowball so he can learn to pull my plow."

LDAF provides LSU Veterinary School students state emergency management training



Celebrate Egg Month with these tempting dishes

Mini Italian Breakfast Casseroles

4 eggs 3 tbsp. milk

1 tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese Dash pepper 1 cup baby spinach, chopped 4 slices ham or 8 thin slices prosciutto (about 4 oz.)

HEAT oven to 350 degrees. Whisk eggs, milk, 1 tbsp. cheese and pepper in medium bowl until blended. Add spinach; stir to mix. Line four greased 10-ounce ramekins or custard cups with ham, pressing against bottoms and sides. Divide egg mixture among ramekins; place in baking pan. Bake in center of 350°F oven until custard is just set, about 20 minutes. Remove from oven; let stand 5 minutes. Sprinkle with cheese.

Coconut Cheesecake

Cooking spray

2 cups crushed coconut cookies

½ cup sugar

½ cup butter, melted

3 (8 oz.) pkgs. cream cheese,

softened

½ cup sugar

6 eggs

1 (15 oz.) can cream of coconut

1 ½ cups fresh frozen coconut,

thawed

½ cup sweetened shredded

coconut, toasted*

Evenly coat the bottom and sides of a 9-inch springform pan with cooking spray, set aside. Combine crumbs, sugar and butter in a small bowl, mix completely. Firmly press into the bottom and 1-inch up sides of prepared pan. Bake crust in a preheated 350°F for 8-10 minutes; let cool in pan. Reduce oven temperature to 325°F. In a large mixing bowl, beat cream cheese with electric mixer, gradually adding sugar. Add eggs, 2 at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir in cream of coconut and thawed coconut. Pour batter into prepared crust. Bake at 325° F until cheesecake looks almost set, but still shakes slightly in center or about 50-60 minutes. Remove from oven and let stand for 10 minutes. Sprinkle toasted coconut around rim of cheesecake or in center if desired. Cool and chill for 8 hours or overnight. Carefully run a thin bladed knife around the rim of the cheesecake; loosen the outside of the pan. Carefully run a long, sharp knife under the crust of the pan to loosen. Carefully transfer cheesecake to serving plate. If desired, serve with a strawberry, raspberry or chocolate sauce or just garnish with toasted coconut and fresh fruit.

*To toast coconut, preheat oven to 350°F. Spread sweetened shredded or flaked coconut on a rimmed baking sheet and bake, stirring once or twice, until golden, about 5 to 10 minutes. If toasting sweetened coconut, check and stir more frequently

Saucy Pasta and Veggie Frittata

Cooking spray

4 eggs

1 (16 oz.) pkg. frozen pasta and

1/4 cup skim or low-fat milk

vegetables in sauce

Water

Evenly coat 10-inch omelet pan or skillet with spray. Add pasta and vegetables in sauce along with water called for on package. Over medium heat, bring to boiling. Cover and reduce heat to low. Cook, stirring occasionally, until pasta is tender, about 5 minutes. In medium bowl, beat together eggs and milk until blended. Pour over pasta/vegetable mixture. Cover. Cook over medium heat until eggs are almost set, about 5 to 6 minutes. Remove from heat. Let stand, covered, until eggs are completely set in center and no visible liquid egg remains, about 2 to 3 minutes. Cut into wedges and serve from pan or slide from pan onto serving platter.

Salad Nicoise

Boston or Romaine Lettuce

9 oz. pkg. frozen Italian green

beans

8 Hard cooked eggs, sliced ½ Cup sliced black olives

4 Medium potatoes

Bottled Italian dressing

4 Medium tomatoes

Cook and drain green beans. Cook, peel and thinly slice potatoes. Slice tomatoes. Arrange lettuce leaves on 4 salad plates. Mound about ½ cup beans in the center of each. Arrange potato, tomato, and egg slices in petal fashion around beans. Sprinkle each salad with about 1 tablespoon olive slices. Serve with dressing.

ZABAGLIONE (Italian Custard)

4 large egg yolks Pinch of salt

2 tbsps. honey or ¼ cup fine sugar ½ cup heavy cream

1 tbsp. fresh lemon juice

Beat egg yolks, honey, lemon juice and salt in a heat proof bowl or in the top of a double boiler. Using a wire whisk or electric mixer continue beating over simmering water until mixture becomes thick and doubles in volume (it should easily coat the back of a spoon). If using sugar, gradually add about a tablespoon at a time, beating well after each addition. Remove yolk mixture from heat; cool slightly. Beat whipping cream in a bowl until stiff peaks form. With a spatula gently fold in whipping cream. Pour into 4 wine glasses or dessert bowls and serve or refrigerate and serve chilled. Serve over fresh fruit such as orange segments, sliced berries; or serve with lady fingers, pound cake or angelfood cake and if desired top with toasted nuts and fruit.

Strain wants natural disaster designation attached to Morganza Spillway opening

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., is urging the United States Department of Agriculture Office of Risk Management to categorize the opening of the Morganza Spillway as a natural disaster.

"I am asserting that the flood waters will overtop the Morganza floodgates regardless of whether the spillway is opened or not," Strain said. "Failure to open the

spillway will result in potential damage to that structure which could result in more severe flooding. The Morganza Spillway will flood either way so therefore flooding from the opening of the spillway should be classified as a natural disaster."

Strain sent a letter to the Louisiana congressional delegation on May 10 asking for their sup-

port to have the natural disaster designation applied to the opening of the Morganza Spillway.


Strain's request to the delegation reads as follows: "At this point, we are uncertain that the Office of Risk Management (ORM) is categorizing this event as a natural disaster. A manmade designation would not allow producers to make crop insurance claims. The ORM is currently requesting information to make the determination of a manmade versus natural disaster. We must continue to make the ORM aware that the purpose of opening the water control structure is for diversion of

floodwaters to the Atchafalaya River. The rising water will overtake the control structure regardless of any opening or diversion."

Strain said more than 18,000 acres of crops within the Morganza Spillway in the fore bay and tail bay will be inundated and lost for the current season. Cotton, soybean, rice, sugarcane, corn, wheat, sorghum, aquaculture and hay crops are

among the commodities that are grown in the Morganza Spillway and Atchafalaya Basin.

Strain said he is hopeful that the ORM will designate the opening of the Morganza Spillway and subsequent flooding of the Atchafalaya Basin as a natural disaster.

Attention Louisiana Cattlemen A vote as to whether to extend the 50

cents per head self-assessed "check-off" fee on cattle sales for another five-year period will be held on May 31 from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The voting will be held at each LSU AgCenter Parish Extension Office.

The check-off fee is collected by the Louisiana Beef Industry Council and is used for adult and junior cattle education research and beef promotion.

Anyone who owned cattle in Louisiana during the year 2010 is eligible to vote.
