LDAF, Gonzales Jambalaya Festival volunteers, help feed Joplin

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) and the Gonzales Jambalaya Festival collected a large donation of rice for jambalaya meals for residents and emergency workers in Joplin, Missouri, the site of a devastating May 22 tornado.

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Gonzales Jambalaya Festival contacted the LDAF for help in locating a rice donor.

Strain said Farmers Rice Milling Company of Lake Charles donated 2000 pounds of rice.

"The rice donation was the result of a coordinated effort between State Rep. M.J. "Mert" Smiley Jr., the LDAF and the USA Rice Federation with one goal in mind, to help our fellow man," Strain said. "I want to personally thank the Farmers Rice Milling Company for their kind donation."

Farmers Rice Milling Company CEO Jamie Warshaw said the company is happy to lend a hand in the relief effort.

"The owners and employees of Farmers Rice

Milling are glad to make the rice donation to assist relief workers in Joplin, Missouri," Warshaw said. "It is our way of supporting those volunteers who are giving up their time to help out those in need."

Volunteers with the Gonzales Jambalaya Festival arrived in Joplin Sunday, June 12 and plan to serve meals for at least three weeks.

Rhett Bourgeois, a Gonzales Jambalaya Festival volunteer team member and organizer of the Joplin trip, said the group is serving 400 to 500 people a day and expecting a much larger crowd over the weekend.

"We want to do our part to help these people who have lost everything," Bourgeois said. "When we arrived, we boiled some fresh Louisiana shrimp and you could just see that the workers were so relieved to not have to eat another peanut butter and jelly sandwich."

Blanchard's Seafood of Grand Isle, Sanderson Farms, Manda Fine Meats, Associated Grocers of Baton Rouge and Blue Runner Foods also made food donations, Bourgeois said.

Sign up now for emergency assistance

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., is urging farmers and ranchers who suffered losses from flooding caused by the Mississippi River and its tributaries to sign up for the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees and Farm-Raised Fish Program (ELAP) through their local USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA).

Losses caused by flooding due to seepage, backwater flooding and the opening of the Morganza Spillway are also included; however, the program would not cover losses between the mainline levee and the river.

ELAP was created in the 2008 Farm Bill and the program is administered by the FSA.

“Producers have just 30 days to file a notice of loss with their parish FSA office after the loss is evident to them and the application for payment must be filed no later than Jan. 30, 2012,” Strain said. “Don’t waste any time. File your paperwork as soon as possible.”

Producers must also provide detailed documentation of their losses in addition to the required applications, Strain added.

Eligible losses include purchased or produced feed for live-

stock, honeybees, farm-raised fish and for physical losses of game fish and baitfish that are not covered under other programs such as the Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payment Program (SURE), Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP), and Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP).

Physical losses on catfish and crawfish are not eligible for this program.

In order to qualify for assistance through ELAP, a producer must have had either crop insurance or Noninsured Assistance Program (NAP) coverage on all crops on their farm, including hay fields,

but excluding pasture that is grazed. This requirement applies to every commodity on every farm in the United States in which the producer has interest.

State FSA Executive Director Willie Cooper said eligible livestock producers who meet the definition of “socially disadvantaged,” “limited resource,” or “beginning farmer” are not required to meet the NAP purchase requirement. A beginning farmer is one who has not owned or operated a farm or ranch for more than 10 years.

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

Caesar Steak Sandwiches

1 lb. boneless beef top sirloin or top round steak, cut 3/4 inch thick	1/4 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
1/2 cup non-creamy Caesar dressing	4 hoagie rolls (6 inches long each), split, toasted
2 cups chopped romaine lettuce	

Cut beef steak lengthwise in half, then crosswise into 1/8 to 1/4-inch thick strips. Reserve 2 tablespoons dressing. Pour remaining dressing in medium bowl. Add beef; toss to coat. Cover and marinate in refrigerator 30 minutes to 2 hours. Remove beef from marinade; discard marinade. Heat large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add 1/2 of beef; stir-fry 1 to 2 minutes or until outside surface of beef is no longer pink. (Do not overcook.) Remove from skillet; keep warm. Repeat with remaining beef. Toss lettuce with reserved dressing and 2 tablespoons cheese in medium bowl. Divide evenly over bottom of each roll. Top with beef; sprinkle with remaining cheese. Close sandwiches.

Beef-Stuffed Peppers

1 lb. ground beef	1/4 tsp. black pepper
4 med. bell peppers	Sauce:
3/4 cup chopped onion	1 (14-1/2 oz.) can Italian-style stewed canned tomatoes, undrained
1/4 cup uncooked white rice	1 tbsp. ketchup
3 tbsps. ketchup	1/2 tsp. dried oregano leaves
1/2 tsp. salt	
1/2 tsp. dried oregano leaves	

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Cut tops off bell peppers; remove seeds. Combine ground beef, onion, rice, 3 tablespoons ketchup, salt, 1/2 teaspoon oregano and pepper in large bowl, mixing lightly but thoroughly. Spoon into peppers; stand peppers in 8 x 8-inch baking dish. Combine sauce ingredients; pour over peppers. Cover dish tightly with aluminum foil. Bake for 1-1/2 hours, until instant-read thermometer inserted into center of pepper registers 160 degrees.

Beef Chili 'n Cheddar-Topped Potatoes

1-1/2 lbs. ground beef	1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
4 medium baking potatoes	Salt and pepper
1 tbsp. chili powder	1/4 cup sliced green onions
1/2 tsp. salt	1/2 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
1 (15 oz.) can hot chili beans, undrained	

Pierce potatoes in several places. Microwave on HIGH 11 to 13 minutes or until tender, rearranging once. Let stand 5 minutes. Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add ground beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into 3/4-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally. Remove from skillet with slotted spoon; pour off drippings. Return beef to skillet; stir in chili powder and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Add beans and 1 cup cheese; cook and stir until heated through. Cut a slit lengthwise in potatoes; fluff potatoes with fork. Season with salt and pepper. Spoon beef mixture evenly over potatoes; sprinkle with green onions and 1/2 cup cheese.

Beer-Braised Brisket with Mustard Sauce

1 boneless beef brisket, flat cut (2-1/2 to 3-1/2 lbs.)	1 (12 oz.) beer
1 tbsp. olive oil	Mustard Sauce:
Salt and pepper to taste	1/2 cup Dijon-style mustard
2 large onions, chopped	2 tbsps. chopped fresh parsley

Heat oil in large stockpot over medium heat until hot. Place beef brisket in stockpot; brown evenly. Remove brisket from stockpot; season with salt and pepper. Add onions to stockpot; cook and stir 3 to 5 minutes or until onions are tender. Return brisket, fat side up, to stockpot. Add beer. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover tightly and simmer 2-1/2 to 3 hours or until brisket is fork-tender. Remove brisket; keep warm. Skim fat from cooking liquid. Increase heat and bring cooking liquid to a boil. Reduce heat and cook 15 to 20 minutes or until mixture is thickened and reduced by half. Meanwhile combine Mustard Sauce ingredients in small bowl. Stir in 2 tablespoons thickened cooking liquid. Pour remaining onion mixture over beef. Serve with Mustard Sauce.

Italian Beef & Cheese Calzone

1 lb. ground beef	1 cup shredded Italian cheese blend
1/2 cup chopped green bell pepper	1 tbsp. cornmeal
1 (14-1/2 oz.) can diced tomatoes with onions, drained	1 (13.8 oz.) pkg. refrigerated pizza crust dough
1/2 tsp. dried oregano leaves	

InstructionsHeat oven to 400 degrees. Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add ground beef and bell pepper; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into 3/4-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally. Pour off drippings. Stir in tomatoes and oregano; continue cooking 5 to 7 minutes or until liquid has evaporated. Remove from heat; stir in cheese. Set aside. Sprinkle cornmeal evenly over rimmed baking sheet. Unroll pizza dough lengthwise on baking sheet, straightening edges of dough if necessary. Spoon beef filling over long half of dough, leaving 1-inch border on 3 sides. Gently lift and pull top half of dough over filling to enclose; pinch dough edges to seal. Bake in 400 degree oven 15 to 20 minutes or until crust is golden brown. Cool 5 minutes. Cut crosswise into 8 slices.



Dairy farmers see higher prices, along with higher costs

Louisiana dairy farmers say this was beginning to look like the year they would make a little money, but now they are not so sure.

For the first time since 2008, farmers are seeing what they are calling decent milk prices, according to LSU AgCenter Area Dairy Specialist Ronnie Bardwell.

But even with the higher prices, dry weather this spring is turning what started out as a really good year into a pretty tough year, Bardwell said.

Troy Ingram, a dairy farmer in Franklinton, estimates that he's been losing almost \$300 a day since the current drought began.

For the past two months he and other dairy farmers have been watching the weather forecasts and praying for rain.

Ingram said it's not nearly as bad as it would if he had higher feed cost.

Ingram saves money by hauling his feed and spreading his fertilizer. And he changed the way he bales hay.

Ingram, who runs a 300-acre operation with Holstein cows realized several years ago that using square hay bales wastes less and stores better.

When the ground is dry, the grass won't grow, and if the grass is not there, the cows



are not producing as much milk, which means trouble for the farmer, Bardwell said.

"When you look at it, Troy is putting 20 pounds less milk per cow in the tank since the drought began," Bardwell said. "If you figure that milk at about 20 cents per pound, then he is losing almost \$9,000 per month

on the 69 cows he's milking."

These numbers make it hard to stay in the business when the price of feed continues to outpace the price the farmers are making on their milk, Bardwell said.

Phillip Verberne III, a Kentwood dairy farmer, pays \$2,200 for six tons of feed. The

same amount of feed was \$900 ten years ago.

"If milk would go up to about 30 cents per pound, we may be able to get some young people interested because they could make a little money" Verberne said.

As it currently stands, the size of the dairy industry in Louisiana is decreasing every year.

"In 1997, when I came to Tangipahoa Parish we had around 300 dairies in the parish," said Kentwood Co-op general manager Bubba Huckaby. "Now there are less than 150 dairies in the state."

Brenda Bankston, owner of Bankston Udderwise Dairy, which has been in operation since 1929, has seen many years like this.

"We just say 'it's gonna get better next year,' but it really doesn't," she said. Dairy farmers just stay at it because it's a good life, but a hard life, she said.

According to the LSU AgCenter's Louisiana Summary of Agriculture and Natural Resources, the total economic contribution from dairying in Louisiana, including milk sales, animal sales and additional processing, was \$126.2 million in 2010. That's up from \$113.6 million in 2009.

La. cattle producers vote to continue checkoff

Louisiana beef producers overwhelmingly voted to continue a 50-cents-per-head assessment on all cattle marketed in Louisiana for the next five years, according to LSU AgCenter officials.

In a referendum held May 31, 80 percent of the cattle producers voting favored continuing the assessment, which supports education, promotion and research in Louisiana, said LSU AgCenter beef specialist Karl Harborth.

The funds are administered by the Louisiana Beef Industry Council board, which represents producers, the Louisiana Cattlemen's Association, the Louisiana Farm Bureau and the Louisiana Livestock Marketing Association.

"The Louisiana cattle industry gains four ways by passing the Louisiana volunteer 50-cent checkoff," said Louisiana Cattlemen's Association executive vice president Robert Joyner.

"This will allow the Louisiana

Beef Industry Council to continue to fund junior education and adult education," he said. "It will also allow us to fund research projects to help raise better quality genetics as well as forages for cattle. Last but not least, it will allow us to promote the wholesome product of beef, which, in return, will increase the price we receive for cattle."

The Louisiana checkoff is in addition to a \$1-per-head national checkoff. Voting was conducted in each parish under the direction of LSU AgCenter agents.

"We're pleased to assist the Louisiana cattle industry by conducting the referendum," said LSU AgCenter vice chancellor Paul Coreil. "The cattle industry is important throughout the entire state."

According to the LSU AgCenter's Louisiana Summary of Agriculture and Natural Resources, the cattle industry contributed more than \$370.5 million to the Louisiana economy in 2010.

Strain elected SUSTA president

Louisiana Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., was elected president of the Southern United States Trade Association (SUSTA) Sunday, June 12 at the annual meeting of the Southern Association of State Departments of Agriculture (SASDA) in Greensboro, North Carolina.

SUSTA is a non-profit agricultural export trade development association comprised of the departments of agriculture of 15 southern states and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. SUSTA works with individual state agricultural agencies like the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry to provide resources to help small business with international trade.

"We're thrilled to have Commissioner Strain as our new president," said SUSTA Executive Director Jerry Hingle. "His vision and leadership is greatly needed at a time when we need to help more companies in our industry become successful exporters while maintaining federal funding for these important programs."

Strain said he will use the position to vigorously promote Louisiana and the other southern states' agricultural outputs.

"Agriculture is one of the few industry sectors of the U.S. economy that has a positive balance of trade," Strain said. "At \$38 billion so far in 2011, food and agricultural exports are up 30 percent and we're forecasting that this year's exports will be the highest ever."

Strain said it is critical that the nation's agricultural sector fully support the Realize America's Maritime Promise (RAMP) bill, sponsored by

Louisiana Congressman Charles Boustany of Lafayette.

"We need to make sure that the American maritime transportation infrastructure is sufficiently maintained to ship our agricultural goods," Strain said. "Passage of the RAMP measure will ensure that taxes

on imported cargo collected by the Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund will be spent entirely on maintenance of America's harbors and waterways, including dredging the lower Mississippi River shipping channel to a depth draft of 45 feet."

Strain said that Boustany's proposal is attracting widespread Congressional support and now has more than 100 co-sponsors.

Strain said SUSTA assists hundreds of companies develop export markets for U.S. food and agricultural products each year. In 2010, companies participating in trade shows, trade missions and other

events sponsored by SUSTA exported more than \$50 million in food and agricultural products and expect another \$78 million sales over the coming year.

"SUSTA's programs are highly effective, yielding \$38 in exports for every dollar that it invests in helping companies export," Strain said.

Strain said SUSTA represents a cross section of industry and business and more than 133 United States companies are participating in SUSTA programs this year.

"SUSTA is a vital, growing organization, with 21 new companies this year and 17 of those are exporting to international markets for the first time and we hope to see that number grow" Strain said. "SUSTA also helped open up 45 new markets and countries for American goods."
