Drought takes toll on Louisiana crops

You don't need to read a newspaper article or monitor a weather web site to know that it's hot.

This summer, Louisiana is experiencing one of the most severe droughts in its history.

The drought is worst in the upland piney woodland west of the Red River plain from Shreveport to Oberlin.

And it's plenty hot in Bossier City where the temperature gauge has hit as high as 111 degrees. Temperatures in northwest Louisiana averaged 92 degrees for the week ending Aug. 21. That's ten degrees higher than normal.

The normal rainfall level for Louisiana at this time of year is 40.47 inches average.

And while the pine forests are suffering, so are the crops along the fertile Red River plain.

John Stone, a Caddo Parish farmer said he planted 900 acres of corn this season but expects to see low yields.

"We're in a sever drought in this area and the heat doesn't help anything especially when it comes to corn," Stone said. "When it gets above 95 degrees, corn doesn't pollinate and we've had above 95 degrees since June."

Stone said some of his corn harvest is setting records — records for low yield, that is.

"Some places are cutting 20 bushels to the acre, some a hundred, but we're averaging around 60-75 right now," Stone said. That's in some of our worst dry land corn where we started (harvesting), so hopefully the yields will pick up when we move to some better land."

South Louisiana corn farmers say their yields are also suffering.

Ray Schexnayder of West Baton Rouge Parish hoped to take advantage of high corn prices this year.

"We're seeing hundred bushel yields when normally it's closer to 200, but our soy beans are looking decent right now," Schexnayder said.

State Climatologist Barry Keim said Louisiana has been keeping track of temperature and rainfall statistics since 1895. Keim said the drought Louisiana is experiencing right now is probably the worst since 1963.

Keim said drought severity is determined by the Palmer Drought Severity Index.



Wildfire Prevention PSAs feature Louisiana celebrities

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said two of Louisiana's most popular residents have been enlisted to help spread the word about wildland fire prevention.

"Former New Orleans Saints quarterback Archie Manning and country music singer Sammy Kershaw were asked to do a series of public service announcements to educate our Louisiana residents on the danger of wildfires during the current drought," Strain said. "We're glad to have these great Louisiana personalities help us get our message out to the public."

Manning recorded one radio public service announcement and

Kershaw did three," Strain said. "It's almost football time and as always, a good defense will be important. The same thing holds true in protecting our forests," says Manning. The PSA ends with Manning saying, "Just like football, protecting our forests is a team effort."

Instead of talking about music, Kershaw reminds us of how much he enjoys the outdoors.

"For many of us, camping and fishing is a family tradition. Do your part to make sure our national forests are there for our kids and grandkids to enjoy," he says in one of the spots. "Never leave a campfire unattended, and when you

leave make sure that the fires is dead out."

Both celebrities also tell listeners to check with local authorities before burning debris.

Strain said the spots were produced by a National Forest Fire Prevention and Education Team brought to the Kisatchie National Forest because the drought has caused the danger of forest fire to be dangerously high.

"Right now, 29 parishes are under a mandatory burn ban issued by State Fire Marshall Butch Browning and my office," Strain said. "LDAF wildland fire-fighting crews are on 24-hour call and are actively suppressing wild-

fires on a daily basis."

Strain said 2,262 wildfires that burned 25,411 acres have already been reported and suppressed through Aug. 29 of this year. In contrast, the state forestry office recorded only 2,335 fires that burned 23,138 acres for all of 2010.

Forestry is the largest agricultural industry in the state with more than 14 million acres in forestland.

The industry contributes more than \$3.1 billion to the state's economy and accounts for more than 13,000 jobs.



"It's difficult to determine when droughts start and end," Keim said. "It looks like the current drought started in February 2010 but we've been 'droughty' since the turn of the century."

Keim said Louisiana posted a -5.29 reading on the Palmer Index in June. Anything under -4.5 is considered "very dry."

Another drought indicator is the United States Drought Monitor by which more than 28 percent of the state is classified as being under "exceptional drought," the highest ranking. The rest of the state is "extreme" to "abnormally dry."

While the drought is bad for farmers, it's equally as bad for forestry interests.

"We've already had one statewide burn

ban and right now 29 parishes are under a state-issued burn ban," said Don Smith, Forestry Protection Chief for the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry. "We'll also be watching for an increase in Ips beetles and mortality in last year's plantings."

A regional forest protection team from the U.S. Forestry Service has been sent to Louisiana to raise awareness for prevention of forest fires.

Paul Waddell, head of the fire-prevention team, understands the potential for wildfire in Louisiana and the devastation it can cause. He's fought many wildfires in his home state of California.

"This (Kisatchie Forest) area is in a seri-

ous drought," Waddell said. "We want people to be cautious when dealing with fires. I know that Rapides Parish has a burn ban in effect. We also want to educate people on how not to cause fires when they're in the Kisatchie National Forest."

Waddell is part of the third U.S. Forestry Service team that has come to Louisiana this year. Each team did a 14 day rotation.

"This is something the U.S. Forest Service organized," Waddell said. "Each team comes in for a 14-day period to talk about fire prevention. I'm a fire-prevention specialist with the Sierra National Forest Service."

"We want to reach people who visit the Kisatchie National Forest, people camping

in the Kisatchie. A lot of people didn't know this area was in a serious drought."

The message of fire prevention is being brought to the schools as well as recreational users of the forest.

Marq Webb, team public information officer from Pineville, said he took the message of fire prevention to area schools.

"Schools will begin to read in their morning announcements about fire dangers," he said. "Announcements will also be made at school football games. We went to every school board in the state with the same message last year. We also visited Nazarene Missionary Baptist Church in Alexandria and discussed fire prevention with adults and children."



Drought may affect deer

Natural deer food may be in short supply this year because drought is causing acorns to drop early, and hogs are competing for them.

That's the word from LSU AgCenter wildlife specialist Don Reed, who talked about establishing and maintaining food plots and managing and enhancing native browse plants for deer at an Aug. 22 deer management meeting in Bossier City.

What you plant has to be palatable, Reed said, adding that the moisture content is important in taste.

Cowpeas, a warm-season forage, are fairly drought-tolerant, and corn husks on the ground are still attractive to deer, he said. "The best warm-season forage plant is soybeans, but you have to plant enough of it so they don't eat it down."

Sept. 1 is the time to plant cool-season food plots, Reed said. A host of clovers can be planted, especially crimson clover because it offers some growth in the fall.

"Deer generally prefer legumes over grasses," Reed said. "Among grasses, deer generally prefer are cereal grains such as oat, wheat and rye over ryegrass."

Whatever is planted should be shorter than 5 feet tall or have fruits or nuts that drop to the ground to be of any value to a deer.

"What you plant is not as important as how you plant it," Reed said. "The best seed in the world will not do well in a poorly managed seed bed."

Clovers and other legumes will not grow well in acid soils, and Reed recommended getting a soil test through the LSU AgCenter to be sure soil conditions are right.

In addition to deer management, Reed said a new law on feral hogs allows the use of any legal firearm at night from March through August. Anyone taking part in these activities at night is required to notify the parish sheriff's office 24 hours in advance of any such hunt.

Trees need special care during drought

Just because a tree has turned brown or dropped leaves during a drought does not mean it is dead.

"Before you cut, make sure the tree is dead," LSU AgCenter forester Hallie Dozier said. "If it is alive, irrigate and protect the root zone."

LSU AgCenter horticulture agent Denyse Cummins concurs with not cutting down trees that have defoliated. "It happens in very dry summers, and it's looking like fall in some areas right now," Cummins said.

Drought in Louisiana has lowered the soil water content to the point where plants, including trees, cannot extract enough water to support normal growth and maintenance, Dozier said.

Trees under drought conditions lose the ability to grow normally, Dozier explained. Stressed trees essentially shift their energy and resources to survival rather than growth. Taking actions that redirect the tree's energy to heal or grow hampers its efforts to survive.

Trees will shift some of their energy to closing stomates on its leaves to help retain water, but that shuts down normal growth. They also shunt energy to grow more roots to capture limited water resources in the soil, and they tap into their food reserves – or stored starches – needed for future growth.

As conditions get dryer, roots cease growth and function, leading to death. This may save the tree energy in the short term, but it severely restricts the tree's ability to recover and resume growth once water again becomes available.

Finally, the tree starts shedding fruits, leaves and branches. This is when most tree owners notice that the tree is under stress – long after drought stress-related changes have begun.

During a drought, irrigation is necessary, Dozier said. "Water the tree deeply and slowly, roughly 10 gallons per inch of tree diameter at breast height."

To water deeply, lay a soaker hose in the critical root zone – between

trunk and edge of canopy or the "drip line" of the tree. "But do not wrap the hose against the trunk or directly water the trunk," Dozier said. "Turn the hose on low and let it run slowly."

Dozier offers the following tips for irrigating trees:

– Check your flow rates after a few hours. If water is running off the surface, turn the hose lower. Slow water application allows you to water the tree roots without loss to runoff or evaporation.

– If your tree is mulched, push mulch aside so water reaches the soil. Avoid disturbing the soil because doing so may disrupt root tissue and hamper the tree's ability to absorb moisture.

– Similarly, avoid digging or otherwise disturbing the soil during drought. "Limit mower, vehicular and pedestrian traffic under the tree during periods of extended drought," Dozier said.

Trees may need two or three days to be watered deeply, depending on soil conditions and tree size. Large trees should be irrigated every two to four weeks during drought. Smaller trees and new plantings may take less time to irrigate, but they need watering at least once a week. Be sure your irrigation plan complies with local water restrictions, if any.

"The LSU AgCenter does not recommend pruning of live branches during drought unless necessary to correct immediate structural or safety issues," Dozier said. She added that leaves are a tree's food manufacturing center, and pruning basically removes some of a tree's ability to make its own food.

From the tree's standpoint, pruning is "wounding," and removing live branches forces the tree to direct energy to closing the wound against pathogens and insects. "When the tree is under drought stress, it needs to use all of its resources just to survive," she said.

"Sometimes it is necessary to prune a tree, and we do so to create and maintain strong structure of the

tree, increasing the tree's chances of survival, and to reduce potential hazards," Dozier said.

But removing live branches can retard the tree's recovery from stresses such as root damage, wind and drought. Because of this, pruning should be done only for reasons that improve or maintain its health and safety, Dozier explained.

"If you have potential hazards such as dead wood or diseased limbs, you can prune anytime during the year. Otherwise, wait until the dormant season to prune live branches," Dozier said, "especially during times of stress, such as high heat or drought."

"Trees under extreme drought may take several years to recover completely after rains resume," Dozier said. Avoid unnecessary pruning and soil disturbance for a few growing seasons after the drought ends.

"When water is plentiful, young trees may benefit from fertilizers that help them put on growth," Dozier said. Larger trees rarely need fertilizing unless soil tests show a lack of necessary nutrients in the soil.

Fertilizers are salts and may harm a drought-stressed tree by pulling water away from the roots. Hold off fertilizing trees until water is plentiful, and then fertilize only when there is a lack of nutrients in the soil or rapid growth is desired, Dozier said.

"If the branch or the whole tree dies, you need professional help," Dozier said.

"Always hire licensed workers."

Louisiana has a state license that requires testing, continuing education and proof of insurance. "Do not hire anyone without first confirming that they are licensed by the State," she said.

To check, call the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry at 225-952-8100. By hiring someone who is not licensed, you are putting yourself at risk for poor work and liability in the event that something goes wrong, Dozier said.





Paddling, canoeing business workshop set for Sept. 28-29 in Monroe

A two-day workshop on developing outdoor recreation on agricultural lands has been scheduled for Sept. 28-29 at Black Bayou Lake National Wildlife Refuge in Monroe.

Sponsored by the LSU AgCenter and Mississippi State University's Natural Resource Enterprises Program, the program will focus on developing agritourism activities featuring wildlife and water systems on farmlands, according to LSU AgCenter agritourism coordinator Dora Ann Hatch.

Guest speakers will talk about revenue potential, outdoor recreational opportunities on farmlands, how to start an outfitter business and legal concerns, as well as hunting and crawfish production, Hatch said.

Nationally known river guide John Ruskey will speak and offer a canoe trip on the first day of the workshop. The river guide and outfitter from Clarksdale, Miss., will lead two 10-person canoes on a two-hour paddle. The fee is \$25.

Keynote speaker for the first day will be Daryl Jones, director of Mississippi State University's Natural Resource Enterprises Program. Jones will present statistics about enterprise development and trends that are making outdoor recreation popular.

Hatch will discuss marketing enterprises, and LSU AgCenter wildlife specialist Don Reed will talk about managing private lands for fee or lease hunting.

Optional activities at the end of the first day will include a photography session and a bird-watching session offered by the Friends of the Black Bayou Lake National Wildlife Refuge.

The second day will give participants an opportunity to learn about successful tourism programs in paddling, becoming an outfitter and legal liabilities associated with navigating waterways.

Keynote speaker for day two will be Tom Potter, executive director of North Carolina Paddle Trails, who will provide information on the economic and social impacts of paddling.

A panel of speakers including Bayou Teche National Wildlife Refuge volunteer Donovan Garcia, Ruskey and Byron Almquist, of Canoe and Paddling Adventures, will talk about how they got involved in paddling and offering their services to others. Both Ruskey and Almquist own paddling businesses. Garcia paddles for fun and leads paddlers along Bayou Teche as a volunteer to encourage participation in the activity.

After the panel, Stuart Johnson, assistant secretary in the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism Office of State Parks; Keith Casio with the Louisiana Natural and Scenic Rivers Program in the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; Bob Strader, Gay Brantley and Jean Mikeal with National Wildlife Refuges in Mississippi and in Monroe and Tallulah, La., will talk about state and national opportunities for nature-based tourism in their respective areas.

During the afternoon session, Lynne Warnock-Dorsey, of Bayou Dorcheat; Stephanie Herrman, of Lake D'Arbonne; Jennifer Ritter, of Bayou Teche; and Steven L. Windham, of the Atchafalaya National Heritage Area will discuss how their paddling trails were developed and their plans for the future.

Jiffy Shrimp & Rice Skillet

1 cup chopped onion	3/4 lb. peeled & deveined shrimp
1 cup sliced celery	
1/3 cup chopped green bell pepper	3 cups cooked rice
2 tbsps. butter or margarine	1/2 tsp. salt
1 (10-3/4-oz.) can condensed cream of shrimp soup	1/4 tsp. ground black pepper
1 cup milk	1/2 cup sliced ripe olives

Cook onion, celery and green pepper in butter until tender but not brown. Blend in soup and milk; heat to boiling. Add shrimp, rice, salt and pepper; continue cooking until shrimp is done, about 7 to 8 minutes. Sprinkle with olive slices, just before serving.

Chicken & Rice Primavera

1 tbsp. olive oil	1 tsp. Italian seasoning
3/4 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1/2-inch strips	1/4 tsp. red pepper flakes
2 garlic cloves, minced	1/4 tsp. salt
2 cups broccoli florets	3 cups cooked rice
2 med. carrots, thinly sliced	1 (14-1/2-oz.) can Italian-style diced tomatoes
1 med. onion, chopped	1/4 cup Parmesan cheese

Heat oil in 12-inch skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add chicken and garlic; cook, stirring 5 to 7 minutes or until chicken is beginning to brown. Add broccoli, carrots, onion, Italian seasoning, red pepper flakes and salt. Cook, stirring 3 to 4 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Add rice and tomatoes. Stir until blended and thoroughly heated. Remove from heat; stir in Parmesan cheese.

Indian-Spiced Shrimp over Coconut-Pineapple Rice

1/2 cup water	1 tbsp. garam masala*
1 (14-oz.) can light coconut milk	1 tsp. pepper
1 (8-oz.) can pineapple tidbits, drained, juice reserved	1 1/2 lbs. med. shrimp, peeled and deveined
1 1/2 tps. salt, divided	2 tbsps. olive oil
1 cup uncooked long grain white rice	1/2 cup plus 2 tbsps. chopped green onions, divided

Bring water, coconut milk, 1/4 cup reserved pineapple juice, and 1/2 teaspoon salt to a boil in medium saucepan over medium-high heat. Stir in rice; cover and reduce heat to simmer. Cook 15 minutes, or until liquid is absorbed. Stir in pineapple and 1/2 cup green onions. Meanwhile, in large bowl, combine remaining 1 teaspoon salt, garam masala and pepper. Add shrimp and saute just until cooked through, about 4 to 5 minutes. Spoon rice onto platter; top with shrimp and remaining 2 tablespoons green onions.

Note: Garam masala is an Indian spice blend found in most supermarkets. If unavailable, substitute curry powder.

Rice-stuffed Chicken Breasts

4 skinless and boneless chicken breast halves, pounded to 1/4-inch thickness	1/4 cup finely diced fresh tomatoes
1/2 tsp. black pepper, divided	1/4 cup finely shredded mozzarella cheese
1/4 tsp. salt	1 tbsp. chopped fresh basil
1 cup cooked brown rice (cooked in chicken broth)	1 tbsp. olive oil

Season insides of pounded chicken breasts with salt and pepper. Combine rice, tomatoes, cheese, basil and remaining 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Spoon rice mixture on insides of chicken breasts; secure sides with wooden picks. Wipe off outsides of chicken breasts with paper towel. Heat oil in large skillet over medium-high heat. Cook stuffed chicken breasts in hot oil 1 minute on each side or just until golden brown. Transfer chicken to shallow baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees 8 to 10 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before slicing.

Lemon Chicken Rice

1 tbsp. olive oil	1 (14-1/2 oz.) can chicken broth
1 lb. boneless, skinless chicken breast, cut into strips	1 tbsp. grated lemon peel
1 clove garlic, crushed	1/2 tsp. ground black pepper
1 cup uncooked rice	

Heat oil in large skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add chicken and garlic; cook and stir until browned. Stir in rice and broth. Cover and cook 15 minutes or until liquid is absorbed. Stir in lemon peel and pepper. Serve immediately.

Smoked Gouda And Spinach Rice Casserole

3 tbsps. oil	1 (10-oz.) pkg. frozen chopped spinach, thawed and drained
1/2 cup finely chopped shallots	2 cups shredded smoked gouda cheese, divided
2 cups sliced mushrooms	1/2 cup whipping cream
3 cups hot cooked long grain white rice	Salt and pepper to taste

Preheat broiler. Heat oil in large skillet over medium-high heat. Add shallots and mushrooms; saute about 6 to 8 minutes or until tender. Add hot rice, spinach, 1 1/4 cups cheese and cream; stir until cheese melts and mixture is heated through. Spoon mixture into lightly greased 2-quart casserole. Sprinkle remaining 3/4 cup cheese over top. Broil about 2 minutes or until cheese melts.

Cydney Free wrapped her arms around her "little" brother, Corey, (who's at least a head taller than her) and said, "I love him to death. Sometimes. Unless we argue and fight ... which does happen."

Corey laughs and said, "I finally made her happy. Finally! After 16 years!"

It just took a world championship in ranch sorting at the 2011 Built Ford Tough AQHYA World Championship Show.

The two siblings, bickering aside, made a good team. Cydney, who's 19, admitted to the Journal that she does sometimes yell at her little brother when he's not paying attention, "but I push him hard because I know he can do better than what he does sometimes."

That was Jennifer's last year in youth, and this year is Cydney's last at the Ford Youth World. So what's Corey going to do for a partner next year?

"I don't know what I'm going to do," he said. "I don't have any more partners. I've got to find me a few. I might pick 'em up off the side of the road or something. That's going to be tough (to find one as good as his sister)."

Cydney promised that she'll be rooting him on.

"I'm going to support my brother all the way. I'm going to help him and come watch him every year," she said.

Master Horseman classes set for Baton Rouge starting Sept. 27

The LSU AgCenter will conduct an eight-week Master Horseman program for adults in the Baton Rouge area, with the first class Sept. 27 at Parker Coliseum on the LSU campus.

Participants must be intermediate riders with knowledge and skill in riding and handling horses.

"No matter how long you've been riding or how much you know about horses, the program will expose students to new things or new techniques," said Neely Heidorn, director of the LSU AgCenter Master Horseman program.

After completing the course, students must be willing to teach and demonstrate equine skills to others, volunteering 20 hours to the LSU AgCenter horse program.

Topics to be covered will include safety, dentistry and health, nutrition, youth development, ground work, basic riding exercises, trailer loading, trail riding, showmanship and conditioning.

Heidorn said the class requires a minimum of 10 students and a maximum of 15.

Mom connects with family through horse hobby

Renee Fontenot Free of Port Allen woke up one morning and made an important discovery.

"My husband will probably say this isn't true, but it is," she said. "I realized my husband had two trucks, two 4-wheelers, two boats and I had two children. I thought it was time to get me a hobby."

So Free bought herself a horse.

"My uncle was in the cattle business in Lake Charles so I was exposed to farm living but my mother never let me have a horse," she said. "Now I have seven."

Now Free shares her horses with her two children, Cydney, 19, and Corey, 16.

Cydney and Corey are fresh off their ranch sorting win at the Built Ford Tough American Quarter Horse Youth Association World Championship in Oklahoma City.

Cydney and Corey's world championship is believed to be the first ever by a brother-sister team from Louisiana.

"They worked very hard in preparation for competing," Free said. "They've been competing since 2003."

Corey rode Skeezi's Streak, a horse once slated for euthanasia. Skeezi's developed laminitis three months after Free purchased him from the previous owner.

"I have seven horses and of them, Skeezi's

is the smartest," Free said. "People told me we were going to have to put him down but I didn't and we nursed him along for 13 months."

When you think about all the hobbies Free could have chosen none held quite the appeal of working with horses.

And Free discovered penning competition was a great way to ride her horses.

"I won the U. S. Team Penning World Championship in West Monroe last year," she said. "There was a team from Venezuela that finished third, a team from Quebec that came out second. My team finished first."

But competing on horseback was not the real reason Free saddled up.

"This was something I could do with my children up into their teens and it would still be cool," Free said. "We have shows together for the next two months."

The Free family plans to compete in Mississippi, Texas and north Louisiana to finish their fall season before resuming competition in January.

"God has given me the opportunity to allow my children to ride," Free said. "He's allowed me to have an extended presence in my children's life and I'm very appreciative."
