## Strain:LDAF battles wildfires across La.

Late August and early September wildfires have affected state residents from New Orleans to Shreveport.

A wildfire near New Orleans that was larger than the Crescent City's famous City Park burned scrub trees and grassy brush on an uninhabited marshy island east of the city called Oak Island.

While the Oak Island Fire was contained by water on all sides and posed no threat to human life or structures, wind pushed the smoke into the central business district and was a problem for residents who suffered from respiratory problems.

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain sent LDAF pilots on daily reconnaissance missions to map the fire, determine burn rates and advise the Orleans Parish Office of Emergency Preparedness on wildfire behavior.

Louisiana Air National Guard helicopters were called in to drop water on the fire.

Ultimately, the contained fire was extinguished by ris-

ing tides and rain from Tropical Storm Lee, which moved through the state Sept. 3 and 5.

While the rains of Lee were welcome in New Orleans, the 35 miles per hour winds fanned the flames of a wildfire that started near the Natchitoches communities of Ashland and Creston on Sept. 2 and 3.

The fire was reported to the Natchitoches LDAF office about 1:45 p.m.

Natchitoches Parish and the most of western Louisiana is enduring "extreme" or "exceptional" drought conditions according to the United States Drought Monitor and environment were perfect for wildfire ignition and spread.

Strain said nine LDAF and three U.S. Forest Service (USFS) crews were on the scene by nightfall and began establishing firelines.

An LDAF firefighting crew is comprised of a bulldozer, an operator and a ground crewmember called a "swamper."

In addition to the two LDAF crews from Natchitoches *See wildfires, continued on page 4*

## LDAF installs new emergency hotline

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry has installed a new emergency hotline phone system to better serve the public.

The new emergency hotline number is 1-855-452-5323.

This hotline will be manned 24

hours a day, seven days a week.

Strain said the LDAF should be immediately notified for any emergencies involving wildfire, pesticides and animal health.

“The LDAF is the lead state agency for the detection and suppression of wildfires,” Strain said. “We investigate woods arson, and with the rash of wild-

land fires due to the extreme drought Louisiana is currently experiencing, your life could be threatened by an out of control wildfire. Call the LDAF immediately if you suspect a wildfire is beginning to burn.”

The LDAF is also investigates all aspects of agricultural theft, whether it be the theft of a

\$100,000 tractor, twenty loads of timber or a valuable thoroughbred, Strain said.

“We are here to protect the consumer,” Strain said. “Remember, call the LDAF for any emergency involving agriculture, pesticides, and wildfire detection and suppression. The number is 1-855-452-5323.”



Parish, crews from Winn, Jackson, Bienville, LaSalle (two crews), Red River (two crews) and Evangeline (two crews) were called in immediately.

Three LDAF aircraft provided aerial support and a USFS Type 3 helicopter equipped with a helibucket bucket dropped water on the advancing fire.

"We threw everything we had and everything we could get our hands on at this fire," Strain said.

"Everything" included two single engine air tankers (SEATS) sent in from Texas to drop fire retardant on the fire. A typical SEAT is a plane used in aerial application (crop dusting) and can drop about 300 gallons of fire retardant at one time, then return to base and reload.

The next day, Lee's winds were still high but the storm had moved on shore and much needed rainfall helped LDAF crews contain the fire that much faster. By 11 a.m., Sept. 3, the fire was contained.

Strain and State Forester Wade Dubea remained at the field command post at Morgan Quick Road and Weaver Cemetery Road until the fire was contained. Strain thanked all the government agencies that cooperated with the LDAF for their help in containing the fire.

"It's a difficult job containing a wildfire like this one," Strain said. "At 4,100 acres, it's the largest wildfire I've been associated with since I took office. Thanks to the LDAF wildland crews, the USFS, local fire

departments, Louisiana National Guard, and the Natchitoches and Winn parish offices of emergency preparedness, we were able to fight this fire as efficiently as possible."

LDAF forestry investigators are investigating the cause of the fire. Firefighting crews did not have much time to rest before they were called out again to battle nine wildland fires that broke out in north Caddo Parish on Sept. 4.

Dozens of homes were evacuated as a large fire traveling at the rate of three mile per hour burned north of Oil City.

Strain issued an evacuation advisory.

"These are serious fires and we are asking all resident's in harm's way to be prepared to evacuate immediately," Strain said. "If a parish deputy or a local fire department official knocks on your door and advises you to evacuate, please cooperate."

Of the nine fires, four were described by LDAF firefighting officials as "major."

All available state resources including Louisiana Air National Guard Blackhawk helicopters were requested.

Sixteen LDAF crews plowed fireline through the night and a USFS Type 3 helicopter with a helibucket was deployed. The largest fires were identified as the Oil City Fire, Airport Fire, Texaco Road Fire and Ida Fire.

The Oil City Fire, estimated at

more than 1,000 acres, was located west of North Market Street and south of the upper reaches of Caddo Lake.

The Airport Fire, also estimated at more than 1,000 acres, burned an area south of Crawford Road (Parish Road 140) near Thacker's Airport.

The Texaco Road Fire was east of Oil City, and the Ida Fire blazed west of Ida off La. Hwy. 168.

Six Louisiana Air National Guard Blackhawk helicopters equipped with helibuckets were available on Sept. 5 and dropped water on hotspots after the fires were contained that morning.

There was no rest for LDAF crews as another large wildfire north of the Vivian Airport in Caddo Parish began to burn Sept. 8. Evacuations were ordered and seven LDAF bulldozer units attacked the fire and contained it the next day.

Exceptional drought conditions and winds estimated at 15 to 25 miles per hour create perfect conditions for wildfire.

Between Sept. 4-11, 19 wildfires had burned 6,526 acres in Caddo and Natchitoches parishes.

In neighboring Bossier Parish, LDAF investigators arrested a Bossier City man and charged him with nine counts of arson.

Kristopher Cooper, 21 of 1925 Rossie Lee Drive, confessed to setting brush and hay bales off Gamble Road, Mercer Road and Goat Hill Road between Sept. 9 and 10.

The fires Cooper is accused of set-

ting were not major fires and quickly contained but not before 500-700 bales of hay was destroyed. The value of the hay could easily be more than \$100,000 at current prices, Strain said.

"Bossier Parish is one of several parishes currently experiencing exceptional drought conditions and wildland fires can spread very rapidly," Strain said. "Our LDAF firefighting crews quickly contained these fires before they could do serious damage to any populated areas, although the loss of 500-700 bales of hay is very serious. Cattlemen in Texas are desperate for hay right now."

Caddo, Bossier and Natchitoches have been under outdoor burn ban

orders since Aug. 24. Other parishes under outdoor burn ban orders are Acadia, Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Bienville, Calcasieu, Caldwell, Cameron, Catahoula, Claiborne, DeSoto, Evangeline, Grant, Jackson, Jefferson Davis, LaSalle, Lincoln, Pointe Coupee, Rapides, Red River, Sabine, St. Landry, Union, Vermilion, Vernon, Webster and Winn.

The Fire Protection Branch within LDAF is dedicated to providing fire protection for Louisiana's forestland owners. As the state's lead agency charged with forest fire suppression, the office works closely with local, state, and federal partners to ensure life and property are protected from the threat of wildfires.

niques, is being replaced with a kinder, gentler way.

Some refer to it as "horse whispering," which has nothing to do with talking in low tones to a horse, said Howard Cormier, equine specialist.

## Use finesse, not force

"The concept of a horse whisperer should really be a horse listener or observer," Cormier said. "Ultimately you're developing a language with the horse."

Once that language is developed, it doesn't take much for horse and owner to communicate, he said. And horses will respond better.

"You've got to reward every little bit of effort," Cormier said.

Punishment for bad behavior also is included in the training, he said.

"It's similar to teaching children," Cormier said. "The mistake most people make is they don't make the horse feel there are consequences for their actions."

That doesn't mean corporal punishment if a horse doesn't follow a command, but it does mean small discomforts.

"You get better results quicker by learning how to do things with finesse and understanding the horse and its psychology, and not forcing things on the horse," Cormier said.

Cormier stood in front of his horse to demonstrate that principle. Just by holding the end of a rope in front of horse, he could signal the animal to walk forward, backward and sideways. If the horse balked, Cormier flipped a small loop into the rein, and the horse complied.

Cormier said a horse will respond to pressure from a

rider to move a certain way, and once the horse responds, the pressure is released, telling the horse it is doing the right thing.

"The release is the most important thing," Cormier said. "If there's no release, a horse doesn't know what to do. You've got to respond to those positive things quickly and immediately."

Understanding the mechanics of how a four-legged animal moves is accomplished by using two sticks to simulate the horse's front legs.

"Until you try to travel like a horse and walk like a horse, it's pretty hard to understand," Cormier said, using the sticks to demonstrate the mechanics of a horse walking, trotting and cantering.

Cormier explained that a rider can get a horse to move more efficiently once the rider understands what a horse is doing during a particular gait.

Johnny Boudreaux of Vermilion Parish is a veteran of the first Master Horseman program in Vermilion Parish.

"It reinforced a lot of stuff, but I also picked up on a lot of things," Boudreaux said.

Boudreaux's specialty is getting stubborn horses into a trailer, and he said he had to change his thinking to get results.

"I messed up enough of them to know we weren't doing something right," he said.

Boudreaux starts by taking the horse to the trailer, letting it sniff the strange new object. If it balks at entering the trailer, he takes it to a clear area and works the horse by requiring it to trot in a circle for several minutes to tire

them out.

"You don't beat 'em up. You make them work."

And a horse, like people, usually figures out it's a lot easier to comply than resist, Boudreaux said. He emphasized patience and advised against expecting too much of a horse too soon.

"You've got to keep asking. You've got to go slow," Boudreaux said.

Boudreaux is convinced that riding horses requires a full understanding of equestrian fundamentals. "If you can't add and subtract, you can't multiply and divide."

Richard Hebert of Indian Bayou, became a 4-H horse instructor after completing the program. He was named 4-H Horse Leader of the Year at the 2004 State Horse Show.

"I've been riding for 30 years, and the program put everything in perspective for me," Hebert said. "It gave me more confidence in teaching."

Hebert also teaches a session in the Master Horseman class that concentrates on negotiating obstacles that might be found on a trail.

"The key there is understanding, and that's probably the hardest thing to teach," he said. "The thing is a horse can't talk."

For Cormier, riding horses is about the learning process and the journey, never expecting to reach the end of the trail. "You don't ever get to a point where you say, 'I've arrived.'"



## Harvest aids featured at soybean meeting

Timing of harvest aid application to a maturing soybean crop is critical, according to an LSU AgCenter expert.

Apply too soon, and yields can be reduced, said LSU AgCenter weed scientist Jim Griffin. Too late, and the potential benefit of earlier harvest won't be realized, he said, speaking Tuesday (Sept. 6) at a harvest-aid clinic on the farm of Buster Hardee.

Several indicators are being used to advise farmers when to spray, Griffin said.

For example, one recommendation calls for spraying when half of the leaves have dropped, but that is not a reliable sign. "Some varieties will retain leaves longer than others," Griffin said.

Griffin conducted a study to determine the best way to tell if a crop is ready for a harvest aid, and he determined the best way is by closely examining beans inside the pod.

A field is not ready to be sprayed until the beans have separated from the white membranes that line seed pods in the top four nodes of plants where seed will be the most immature. The separation of the beans from the membrane will create a space between the bean and the inner pod wall, and the beans should easily pop out of the pod, he said.

Once this occurs, the beans have reached maximum dry weight – or physiological maturity – and leaf removal will not negatively affect yield, he said. The longer harvest-aid application is delayed, the later the crop will be ready to harvest.

An application made too early is more detrimental to determinate varieties in maturity groups 5 and 6 than to indeterminate varieties in maturity group 4.

The highest labeled rate of Gramoxone Inteon is 16 ounces per acre, and it is critical that either a nonionic surfactant or crop oil concentrate be added, Griffin said.

Sodium chlorate can also be used as a harvest aid, but it can be inconsistent, he said. Good coverage of the soybean foliage is critical with both sodium chlorate and Gramoxone Inteon/paraquat products.

He recommended that spray volume be at least 15 gallons per acre with ground rigs and 5 gallons per acre for aerial application.

Roughly 95 percent of north Louisiana soybean fields are sprayed with a harvest aid, said LSU AgCenter soybean specialist Ron Levy. If an extended period of rain follows an application, bean quality could deteriorate, he added.

## Master Horseman: Riders learn a firm, gentle approach to horse care

It might seem like that buckaroo who rides off into the sunset was born in the saddle. But the truth is he or she had to learn equestrian skills. And a good place to learn these skills is through the LSU AgCenter Master Horseman Program.

"The goal is to have a cadre of extremely well-trained leaders around the state and increase the quality of horsemen and horses," said Neely Heidorn, equine specialist. "The idea is to bring them up several notches and teach them to teach others."

To help raise funds to continue the Master Horseman Program, Heidorn has organized a polo match on Oct. 2 in Folsom. Read more about the AgCenter's first sponsored polo match.

The Master Horseman Program's purpose is to improve the horsemanship skills of adults and prepare them to serve as leaders in the 4-H Horse Program and within the Louisiana horse industry. It includes eight weeks of instruction on many topics related to equine science and horsemanship. Since its inception in 2002, more than 600 men and women have graduated from the program, and serve in leadership roles in horse organizations and youth programs across the state.

The Master Horseman program consists of eight 3-hour sessions, starting with an hour lecture by

various experts on scientific and technical advances in nutrition, health, management and care of horses. The sessions cover a wide range of topics, including nutrition, safety, conditioning, foot care, and dental health. The second hour is devoted to a demonstration of horse training techniques, and the third hour involves practicing the skills they have learned. All of that is followed by a test.

**Volunteer service required**

"When horse leaders complete the training they are required to

give 40 hours of volunteer service to the horse industry to train other horsemen and youth," Neely said. "The trained volunteers have subsequently been active in the 4-H youth program, conducting horse camps, clinics, seminars and workshops."

Much of the course work is aimed at getting horse owners to learn more about the way their horses move and what motivates the animals. The old-school approach to training a horse, using corporal punishment tech-

## Master Horseman classes set for Baton Rouge

The LSU AgCenter will conduct an eight-week Master Horseman program for adults in the Baton Rouge area, with the first class Sept. 27 at Parker Coliseum on the LSU campus.

Participants must be intermediate riders with knowledge and skill in riding and handling horses.

"No matter how long you've been riding or how much you know about horses, the program will expose students to new things or new techniques," said Neely Heidorn, director of the LSU AgCenter Master Horseman program.

After completing the course, students must be willing to teach and demonstrate equine skills to others, volunteering 20 hours to the LSU AgCenter horse program.

Attendance is required for at least 6 of the 8 sessions held on Tuesdays from 5:30-9 p.m.

Cost of the class is \$250 to pay expenses of the program. Students are required to provide their own horses and transport them to the classes. All horses must have a negative Coggins test result, and no studs are allowed.

Topics to be covered will include safety, dentistry and health, nutrition, youth development, ground work, basic riding exercises, trailer loading, trail riding, showmanship and conditioning.

Heidorn said the class requires a minimum of 10 students and a maximum of 15.
