Longleaf Restoration Field Day held Oct. 5

Louisiana's longleaf pine forest has been drastically reduced over the years, but Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain said the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) is helping the hardy tree make a comeback.

Strain said a variety of cost-share program offered through the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry and other agencies will help encourage landowners to plant longleaf pine trees.

"The LDAF's Forest Productivity Program can reimburse a landowner up to half of the qualified expenses up to \$10,000," Strain said. "Timber and the FPP program is a great economic development project."

Strain said the LDAF program applies not only to longleaf but other pine species and hardwoods.

The LDAF also grows and supplies more than 567,000 containerized and bare-root longleaf seedlings annually to the market. The seedlings are grown at the LDAF pine nursery in Beauregard Parish.

Strain made his comments at a special Oct. 5 Longleaf Restoration Field Day at the Southern Forest Heritage Museum in the vintage lumber town of Longleaf off Hwy. 165 south of Alexandria.

Landowners were told about the benefits of growing longleaf pine, forestry techniques and funding sources. Various state and federal agencies presented a multitude of cost-sharing plans to help landowners establish new longleaf or re-plant acreage.

The LDAF, U.S. Forest Service, Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the National Wild Turkey Federation and the Texas-Louisiana Longleaf Task Force were involved in the program.

Kisatchie National Forest Supervisor Mike Balboni told the 200 attendees that the native longleaf species is fire, insect and disease resistant and grows well on upland Louisiana sites.

Longleaf pine trees can also grow more than 100 feet tall and live more than 200 years, forest officials said. The old growth longleaf pine forest once covered 90 million acres of longleaf pine in the South, but that number is now down to 3 million acres.

Luke Lewis, National Wild Turkey Federation regional biologist, said longleaf is the second-most diverse ecosystem after the rainforest and is a great ecosystem for turkeys.

"We work with the National Resource Conservation Service and private landowners to do management plans for landowners to restore longleaf to their lands," Lewis said.

"There's a lot of financial benefits for residents to grow longleaf. You could sell the wood for a good profit in addition to having a turkey population for hunting."

Rick Jacob, Texas-Louisiana Longleaf Task Force chairman, said longleaf provides "great biological diversity."

Lewis said the National Wild Turkey Federation and NRCS have a 90 percent cost-share program for residents to grow longleaf.

"Once a landowner has their land cleared, they can get 90 percent cost share for site-prep work, containerized seedlings and planting costs under the Wildlife Habitat Incentive Program," he said. "It's a 15-year agreement with the federal government. It also has the ability to do 90 percent of cost share for four to five prescribed burns. It's a tremendous cost saving to a landowner."

Officials from the participating agencies are hoping program incentives will help encourage landowners to plant longleaf pine acreage on private lands.

Louisiana awarded Specialty Crop Block Grant

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) was awarded \$341,212.54 of grant money for research, educational and marketing projects to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops in Louisiana.

Strain said the funding came from a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Specialty Crop Block Grant Program (SCBGP) and awarded 55 grants that will fund 740 initiatives across the United States and its territories. The grants will help strengthen the market for specialty crops like fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture and

nursery crops, including floriculture.

The Louisiana projects to be funded with this grant award are as follows:

sLSU AgCenter will develop a media campaign to increase "Louisiana Super Plants" logo recognition and expand it into all markets in Louisiana

s1stCo Inc. Video Productions will develop and produce a TV series to educate consumers on the types of specialty crops available in Louisiana and then demonstrate new and delicious ways to prepare them.

sMarketumbrella.org to introduce underserved children living in urban areas to Louisiana specialty crops via educational field

trips to the Crescent City Farmers Market with a specific focus on strawberries and citrus.

sLSU AgCenter to evaluate disease and insect resistance, yield and time to market of the increasing number of vegetable and fruit varieties available for production in local markets and educate local growers on results.

LDAF will perform pre-award and post-award activities to administer the Specialty Crop Block Grant Program funding and ensure that the LDAF and sub-awardees abide by federal and state requirements and regulations. All programs will be completed during a one to three year span.

Strain said to evaluate applica-

tions, LDAF formed a four-member panel with combined expertise in biological sciences, horticulture, fruit production, vegetable production, dairy production and commodity marketing to review applications.

"Agriculture is the backbone of Louisiana's economy, that is why it is so important to invest in the specialty crop industry," Strain said. "All of the proposals were beneficial, but the panel and I agreed these projects will serve the state's specialty crops needs best at this time."

Michelle Estay, LDAF commodity promotion and research director, said she expects the specialty crop grant program to be funded next year and anticipated accept-

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

Grant awarded to La. company to help new farmers

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) awarded a \$103,700 grant to Latino Farmers Cooperative of Louisiana, New Orleans, to provide training and assistance to beginning farmers and ranchers.

The grant project will address priority training needs of Latino farmers, including production and management strategies, business management and decision support strategies and marketing strategies.

The Louisiana grant is one 36 grants totaling \$18 million to organizations that will help beginning farmers and ranchers run successful and sustainable farms.

Strain said it's important to attract new agricultural producers into the profession.

"As the average age of America's

farmers and ranchers increases, and with traditional rural populations in decline, it's critical that we train the next generation of American producers now," Strain said.

Kathleen Merrigan, the USDA's deputy secretary, agreed.

"Beginning farmers and ranchers face unique challenges, and these grants will provide needed training to help these producers become profitable and sustainable," said Merrigan. "American agriculture supports one in twelve jobs in America, a critical contribution to the strength and prosperity of the country."

Strain said new farmers are necessary for the United States to maintain its preeminent position as an international agricultural leader.

"The productivity of the American farmer has given our

residents access to an inexpensive, but nutritious food supply," Strain said. "Americans have more discretionary income spending power because food doesn't cost as much as it does in other countries, but as our farmers age, and more young people look outside of farming for their careers, we have to do everything we can to encourage new farmers and ranchers."

USDA's National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) awarded the grants through its Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program (BFRDP). Under BFRDP, which was established through the 2008 Farm Bill, NIFA makes grants to organizations that implement education, training, technical assistance and outreach programs to help beginning farmers and ranchers, specifically those who have been farming

or ranching for 10 years or fewer.

At least 25 percent of the program's funding supports the needs of limited resource and socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers, as well as farm workers who want to get a start in farming and ranching.

In addition to Louisiana, projects were awarded in Arizona, California, the District of Columbia, Georgia, Iowa, Maine, Mississippi, Montana, Nevada, New Jersey, New Hampshire, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Texas, Vermont, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Washington, Wisconsin and Wyoming. Project highlights include:

A project in New York to provide workshops, conferences, apprenticeships, online resources and mentoring services for more than

1,200 beginning farmers by 2014.

A project in Montana to offer financial, credit and marketing training to beginning American Indian farmers.

A project in Mississippi to develop and disseminate training materials and decision-making tools to high school and college students who plan to enter farming and ranching.

LSU AgCenter hopes to turn biofuels grant into business opportunities

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has awarded the LSU AgCenter a five-year \$17.2 million grant to speed up the process for developing biofuels and biochemicals from sugarcane and sweet sorghum.

The grant is part of a \$136 million package the USDA gave to five universities with the overarching goal of helping to generate rural jobs and decrease dependence on foreign oil. The other grantees are the University of Washington, Washington State University, Iowa State University and the University of Tennessee.

The LSU AgCenter was selected because of its successful track record in biofuels development using sugarcane and in working with the sugarcane industry, according to Vadim Kochergin, a researcher at the AgCenter's Audubon Sugar Institute and the principal investigator for the project.

"One question the USDA wants answers to is how much money can a farmer sustainably make to produce biofuels or bio-derived chemicals," said Kochergin, who is also the newly-named director of the Louisiana Institute for Biofuels and Bioprocessing.

The economics of converting crops into fuel and other products is a major part of the grant, and extensive analyses of all the production scenarios will be conducted by the AgCenter.

"We have to address issues of harvesting, processing, storage, pre-treatment and conversion," Kochergin said. "We may find that the price of gasoline must be at least \$5 a gallon before farmers could make any money. But this is the kind of information we need."

To carry out the project, AgCenter scientists are partnering with several companies in the biofuels business:

- A Wisconsin-based company, Virent Energy Systems (gasoline, jet fuels and diesel chemicals).

- Three California-based companies -

- Danisco/Genencor (isoprene), Optinol (butanol) and Ceres (seed for sweet sorghum crops).

- John Deere based in Louisiana (harvesting equipment technology).

- Florida Sugar Cane Growers Coop (biomass drying).

- MS Processors out of Minnesota (sugar engineering).

The diversity of industry partners is one of the reasons the AgCenter won the grant over more than 60 other universities, according to John Russin, vice chancellor for research.

"We have technologies that take waste materials from sugar mills and produce specialty chemicals, plastics and alcohol-based fuels," Russin said. "Our industry partners have their own private technologies, and they will be testing these on the feedstocks we develop in Louisiana."

One of the feedstocks that will be investigated by the AgCenter in partnership with the USDA Agricultural Research Service out of Houma, La., is a variety of sugarcane called "energy" cane, which has more fiber content than conventional sugarcane. It may have increased cold tolerance and provide higher biomass yield. This USDA lab is also a partner for this grant project, Kochergin said.

Another reason the AgCenter was awarded the grant was the close working relation-

ship established already through the Louisiana Institute for Biofuels and Bioprocessing, which was started in 2009 as a way to bring scientists and industry representatives together to collaborate on projects and seek grants. Russin was the first director, and Kochergin was named director in August.

Kochergin said this grant will in no way take away from the work the AgCenter does to ensure Louisiana sugarcane farmers produce the highest sugar yields. "The project will add value to our stakeholder community. If we are successful with this grant project, we will offer sugarcane farmers more flexibility to produce crops for more markets," Kochergin said. "We hope to increase the stability of agriculture in the state."

Louisiana had more than 400,000 acres in sugarcane in 2010, according to AgCenter figures, for a total value of about \$750 million to the Louisiana economy.

Louisiana produces no sweet sorghum, which is a fibrous crop that can be produced on low-quality land with agricultural inputs. AgCenter research has found that

this crop can be an excellent source of biomass for bioenergy products, Russin said.

About two-thirds of the grant money will be funneled into research and the remaining third into education and extension. The AgCenter will sponsor training sessions to help businesses learn new technologies for biofuels use and help farmers learn to grow energy crops.

One of the major ways the grant project will help boost biofuels development is through the expansion of the small-scale biorefinery at the Audubon Sugar Institute, Kochergin said.

"We will be able to test how some of the technologies will work in the real world," Kochergin said, adding that the biorefinery will also be used for demonstrations and workforce training.


Sugarcane factories are biorefineries, Kochergin said. But they are in use only during the months while they grind sugar during sugarcane harvest. The technologies developed because of this grant may provide a way for these factories to be open year-round. Louisiana has 11 operating sugarcane factories.

Kochergin said the grant project has implications beyond Louisiana and should benefit the entire southeastern United States.

"We can't guarantee but we certainly hope that new businesses will start up or that X number of jobs will be created," Kochergin said. "But information generated as a result of the grant should bring growth and expansion in the ag sector."

Russin said to the best of his knowledge this is the single largest grant ever received by the AgCenter.

The other universities that are partners in this grant include Southern University, Texas A&M University, the University of Arkansas at Monticello, Morehead State University in Kentucky and the University of Wisconsin-Madison.





LSU AgCenter offers forestry, ag bioenergy business workshops

The LSU AgCenter is offering four workshops for forest landowners and agricultural producers to help them identify opportunities in emerging markets for converting wood or agricultural crops into energy.

With a climate and soils capable of quickly growing a wide variety of crops and forests, Louisiana has great potential to expand its energy portfolio with production of biofuels, electricity and pellets made from forests and other plant biomass, said Rich Vlosky, director of the LSU AgCenter Louisiana Forest Products Development Center in the School of Renewable Resources.

The workshops, which will be held during November, will include information on bioenergy and biofuel production options, potential economic effects of bioenergy in Louisiana, landowner and policy-maker perceptions of bioenergy markets and management issues for forests and cropland, Vlosky said.

Two workshops will focus on forest production and two will focus on agricultural crops.

The forest workshops are scheduled for Nov. 2 at the LSU AgCenter Hammond Research Station in Hammond and Nov. 15 at the Dean Lee

Research Station south of Alexandria. The sessions will provide information on potential opportunities for forest landowners interested in woody biomass obtained from thinning conventional forests, raising fast-growing trees for energy and collecting post-harvest residue for various energy products.

The agriculture workshops are scheduled for Nov. 3 at the LSU AgCenter Rice Research Station in Crowley and Nov. 29 at the Macon Ridge Research Station in Winnsboro. These workshops will provide information on potential opportunities for agricultural producers interested in emerging markets for biofuels produced from agricultural residues and dedicated energy crops.

Times for all workshops are 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Attendance is free, and lunch will be provided. Pre-registration is required and limited to 120 attendees for each workshop. Registration for all workshops begins Oct. 3 and will continue until the maximum of 120 is reached.

Strain helps launch GulfSource.org



LDAF, LDWF, LDHH and LDEQ launch website with all tests results as part of the Louisiana Seafood Safety Plan

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain joined other Louisiana officials Oct. 7 to announce the launch of GulfSource.org, a site that makes public all of the seafood, water and sediment safety testing information conducted since the 2010 BP Oil Spill under the Louisiana Seafood Safety Plan. The site, which allows users to scroll through all available samples or

conduct specific searches by area, date or sample type, utilizes information from the Louisiana departments of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF), Health and Hospitals (LDHH), Environmental Quality (LDEQ), and Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF).

"Though we've been testing seafood, water and sediment since April 30, 2010 in response

to the BP oil spill, the information has been difficult to widely distribute to the public until the launch of GulfSource.org," said LDWF Secretary Robert Barham. "We hope the public will utilize GulfSource.org to find out what the safety test results in seafood from areas they fish or from waters they consume reveal. What is truly encouraging is that, to date, not a single sample has

failed our safety tests. We now we have the tool to share those results with the general public. Rebuilding our seafood brand starts with rebuilding consumer confidence in our product. We hope GulfSource.org helps us accomplish that task."

"The public should have easy access to food safety information and GulfSource.org is a great companion to the work we're already doing with EatSafe.La.Gov," DHH Secretary Bruce D. Greenstein said. "Transparency of critical health and safety information is a top priority at DHH, where we worked with our state agency partners to publish seafood testing results almost immediately after the BP disaster and throughout the following year. GulfSource takes that work to the next level and allows the world to see for itself that we have the most-tested seafood out there."

"Now it will be easier for people outside of Louisiana to know what we already know – the seafood is safe and as good as ever," said DEQ Peggy Hatch. "The goal of the plan was to ensure seafood safety for all the people who enjoy the best seafood in the world. With the launch of this new website, anyone will be able to see the results. This is the culmination of a statewide effort from many agencies to develop and execute a sampling plan like none other."

"Our office has a long history of ensuring the quality and safety of Louisiana food," said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. "It's our duty to continue this obligation to our Louisiana seafood industry and the consumers and patrons that enjoy shrimp, crab and finfish."

Louisiana officials reached an agreement with BP to test seafood, sediment and water from across the Louisiana coast for traces of toxins called polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) and for dispersants called Dioctyl sodium sulfosuccinate (DOSS). The agreement funds the testing program, called the Louisiana Seafood Safety Plan, up to \$18 million for a total of three years (\$6 million per year).

To date, none of the samples tested have showed levels of PAHs or dispersants near the U.S. Food and Drug Administration-established "level of concern." In fact, of the samples that showed any minute traces of PAHs, none were above background levels (the levels found in seafood before the oil spill). Test results for dispersants are also available on GulfSource.org.

GulfSource.org allows the general public full access to information on how testing is conducted, specifically where it is conducted, and when and what the results from the lab analyses show.
