USDA proposes new animal disease traceability rule

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has released its proposed Animal Disease Traceability Rule for public comment before it is adopted, Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain said.

Livestock covered by the new rule are cattle, bison, sheep, goats, swine, horses, other equine, captive cervids and poultry.

It is proposed by the USDA that all livestock entering interstate commerce must comply with this new rule which is slated to take effect early 2013.

There are three main parts to the rule that apply to all covered species: official identification, Interstate Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (ICVI) and records management.

Official ID will be required for each species that enters interstate commerce.

For cattle and bison, it means each animal should have official eartags, metal brucellosis tags or 840 electronic (RFID) tags.

Equine requirements include a description (as with EIA test), electronic ID, registration tattoo, or digital photo. All poultry will need leg bands or a group identification number (GIN). Sheep and goats should have electronic implants, official Scrapie eartags, USDA backtags or registry tattoos.

Swine requirements are official eartags, USDA backtags, official swine tattoos or ear notching. Cervids will need official eartags or another USDA approved unique and traceable ID method.

The law will begin with cattle (bison) and will phase in other species with exemptions. The exemptions include all sexually intact cattle 18 months or older, all dairy cattle, all cattle used for

rodeo and recreational events and all cattle used for shows and exhibitions

There are some exemptions to the official ID and include use of other ID agreed upon between states (brands, tattoos, and breed registries), commuter herds, movement through a state and back and cattle moved directly to an approved tagging site where they receive official ID before comingling with other cattle.

Temporary exemptions to official ID include beef cattle under 18 months old (feeder steers and heifers) and cattle moved directly to slaughter with a USDA backtag.

ICVI (health certificates) written by a Category II accredited veterinarian will be required for all livestock entering interstate commerce with individual ID numbers unless they are exempt. The exemptions to the ICVI rule are cattle that are moved directly to slaughter or stockyards with an ownership statement (waybill), cattle moved interstate for veterinary examination without change of ownership, cattle moved through a state and back and cattle moved as a commuter herd.

Records management is included in the new proposal. The state, the accredited veterinarian, or livestock facility who issue official ID tags must maintain distribution records and keep ICVIs for five years. The accredited veterinarian must forward a copy of the ICVI to the State Veterinarian's Office of origin within five working days and that office must forward a copy to the State Veterinarian's Office of destination within five working days.

SPCC compliance date extended for farmers

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has amended the date by which farms must prepare and implement their Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure (SPCC) Plans to May 10, 2013, Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., said.

Strain said agricultural interests across the state have issues with the proposed rules and the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry sent an official statement to the EPA.

"The proposed measures will

cause severe economic hardships to Louisiana farmers who have already suffered tremendous losses from flooding as well as drought," Strain said. "The disaster conditions impacted planting schedules and have limited farm budgets."

Strain said many state farmers are already implementing scientifically based best management practices through the Louisiana Master Farmer Program. The program addresses on-farm fuel storage issues.

"These BMPs are reducing the amount of pollutants released

into air and state waters," Strain said. "The Master Farmer Program is firmly rooted in state law and backed by sound science. It's a critical component of Louisiana's overall nonpoint source management plan."

Strain said the USDA acknowledged that an overwhelming segment of the continental United States was affected by wildland fires and flooding during the spring and summer of 2011. Many counties in a number of states were declared disaster areas by either the federal or state government or both. As a

result, the EPA delayed the rule change.

Strain said the amendment, if implemented, does not remove the regulatory requirement for owners or operators of farms in operation before August 16, 2002, to maintain and continue implementing an SPCC Plan in accordance with the SPCC regulations then in effect. Such farms continue to be required to maintain plans during the interim until the applicable compliance date for amending and implementing the amended Plans. Finally, the amendment does not

relieve farms from the liability of any oil spills that occur.



The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, Veterinary Health Division, will issue the metal "Brite tags" to producers and Category II accredited veterinarians and will maintain the records on a state-run system. RFID tags can be purchased from commercial vendors and producer information will be maintained in the LDAF state system or vendor systems with LDAF access.

Similar ID and tracking methods were used to eradicate brucellosis in Louisiana, but since then the numbers of officially identified cattle have drastically declined. This ID information will only be used to improve the state's ability to trace livestock if a disease outbreak occurs.



Cream of Spinach and Yam Soup

1 cup chopped onion	1 (10 oz.) bag fresh spinach leaves, stemmed and coarsely chopped
1/2 cup chopped celery	2 cups skim milk
1 red bell pepper, seeded and chopped	1/2 cup sliced green onion stems (scallions)
2 tbsp. minced garlic	Salt and pepper to taste
1 cup all-purpose flour	
3 (16 oz.) cans fat-free chicken broth	
3 cups fresh sweet potatoes, peeled and diced	

In a large heavy pot coated with nonstick cooking spray over a medium-high heat, cook the onion, celery, red bell pepper and garlic until the vegetables are tender, about 5 to 7 minutes. Stir in the flour and gradually add the chicken broth, whisking until the soup is blended. Add the sweet potatoes and bring to a boil, reduce the heat and cook approximately 20 minutes or until the potatoes are very tender. Add the spinach, milk, green onion stems, salt and pepper. Cook until spinach is wilted and soup well heated and thickened, about 5 minutes.

Yam Cornbread Stuffing

2 cups fresh sweet potatoes, peeled and chopped	1/4 cup chopped parsley
1 cup chopped onions	1 tsp. ground ginger
1 cup sliced celery	5 cups crumbled cornbread
2 tbsp. light margarine	1/4 cup pecans
	Chicken broth

In a large skillet, cook sweet potatoes, onion and celery in margarine for 5 to 7 minutes or until just tender. Spoon mixture into a large mixing bowl. Stir in parsley and ginger. Add cornbread and pecans. Toss gently to coat. Add enough chicken broth to moisten. Place stuffing in a casserole dish. Bake uncovered at 375 degrees for 45 minutes or until heated through. Makes about 6 cups (10 servings).

Yam Pecan Pie in Ginger Snap Crust

1 1/4 cups gingersnap cookie crumbs	1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon
2 tbsps. butter, melted	1/4 tsp. ground nutmeg
1 1/2 tps. vanilla	3 egg whites
1 (15 oz.) can sweet potatoes, drained and mashed	2/3 cup dark corn syrup
2 eggs, divided	1/2 cup sugar
1/4 cup light brown sugar	2 tps. vanilla extract
	2/3 cup pecans, chopped

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine gingersnap crumbs, butter, vanilla in pie plate, pressing up sides. Bake 10 minutes, remove from oven. In mixing bowl, blend together sweet potatoes, 1 egg, brown sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg. Spread evenly on bottom of pie crumb crust. In mixing bowl, beat together remaining egg, egg whites, corn syrup, sugar, vanilla until mixture is creamy. Stir in pecans. Carefully spoon over yam layer. Bake 50-60 minutes or until filling is set around edges or until knife inserted halfway between center and edge comes out clean.

Cranberry Yam Bread

2 large eggs, slightly beaten	1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1 1/3 cups sugar	1 tsp. ground cinnamon
1/3 cup canola oil	1/4 tsp. ground allspice
1 cup fresh sweet potatoes cooked and mashed	1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. vanilla extract	1 cup chopped cranberries

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Coat 9x5x3-inch loaf pan with nonstick cooking spray and dust with flour. In large bowl, combine eggs, sugar, oil, sweet potatoes, and vanilla. In separate bowl, combine flour, cinnamon, allspice, and baking soda. Make a well in the center. Pour yam mixture into well. Mix just until moistened. Stir in cranberries. Spoon batter into prepared loaf pan. Bake for 1 hour or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Southwestern Roasted Vegetables

4 cups peeled, cubed sweet potatoes, cut in 1-inch cubes	1 small red onion, chopped
1 1/2 cups zucchini, cut into small chunks	1/2 lbs. mushrooms, halved
1 cup yellow squash slices, halved	2 tbsps. olive oil
	3 tbsps. taco seasoning mix
	Salt to taste

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Coat baking sheet with nonstick cooking spray or line with foil. In large bowl, combine sweet potatoes, zucchini, yellow squash, onion, and mushrooms. Toss with olive oil to coat vegetables. Sprinkle with taco seasoning, toss and spread vegetables on baking sheet. Bake 40 minutes, shaking pan ever 15 minutes, until vegetables are tender and roasted.

Sweet Potato Cranberry Galette

2 tbsps. margarine or butter	1/4 cup light brown sugar
1 tbsps. olive oil	1 tbsps. ground ginger
1 cup chopped onion	2 -2 1/2 lbs. sweet potatoes (yams)
1 cup dried cranberries	

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. In a skillet, heat margarine and olive oil and sauté onions until tender, about 5 to 7 minutes. Add cranberries, brown sugar and ginger, stirring until mixed. Line a 9-inch round cake pan with aluminum foil and coat with non-stick cooking spray. Peel potatoes and slice very thin, preferably with a food processor. Spoon one tablespoon of cranberry mixture in center of cake pan. Arrange one third of the sweet potato slices in concentric circles, overlapping in bottom of pan. Spread half of cranberry mixture over potatoes. Top with another one third sweet potato slices, arranged in same manner. Top with remaining cranberry mixture ending with sweet potatoes. Coat a sheet of aluminum foil with nonstick cooking spray and cover sweet potatoes tightly. Cook for 40 minutes, uncover and continue baking for an additional 20 minutes or until brown and crisp on top and potatoes are tender. Place serving plate on cake pan and invert.

less susceptible to transplant shock."

In addition to the billboards and print ads, Strain said posters of the Les Miles ad will be distributed to nurseries and retail outlets throughout the state.

Louisiana has about a dozen turfgrass farmers who harvested 4,085 acres in 2010. The farms are spread across the state but the largest one is located near Welsh in southwest Louisiana. The gross farm value of the crop is \$20.4 million. About 60 percent of the crop is in centipede grass.

The Louisiana Grown turfgrass campaign is funded through the Louisiana Specialty Crops Program, which is administered by the LDAF.

The United States Department of Agriculture – Agricultural Marketing Service (USDA-AMS), as directed by the 2008 Farm Bill, has issued funds to states to increase the competitiveness of their specialty crops. The turfgrass project is just one of Louisiana's funded projects. Other commodities, like strawberries, citrus, sweet potatoes, and pecans, have also received assistance in recent years.
