New forestry specialty license plates available

A new license plate, designed by the Louisiana Forestry Association, is now available at the Office of Motor Vehicles (OMV) the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) announced recently.

“The timber industry is one of the largest industries in the state of Louisiana. Part of the proceeds from the license plate will go to the Office of Forestry at the Department of Agriculture

and Forestry to enhance fire protection and theft enforcement programs plus anything else that will protect this natural resource,” said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

The plate is \$50 to have registered for two years, a \$3.50 production cost, \$8 OMV handling fee, plus the normal registration cost. Credit will be given for unexpired license fees if you renew early.

Prune roses in early Feb.

Early February is an excellent time to cut back roses growing in your landscape. Hybrid tea and grandiflora roses, in particular, should be pruned around this time every year. Otherwise, these roses tend to become leggy, less vigorous and unattractive and do not bloom as well.

Other types of roses - such as floribunda, polyantha, landscape and repeat-blooming old garden roses - generally require less drastic pruning but still benefit from pruning to improve their shape or control their size when necessary.

If you have purchased or intend to purchase new rose bushes, you don't have to worry about pruning them. Newly purchased roses have already been pruned, and no further pruning is required.

When you prune, use sharp bypass-type hand pruners that make clean cuts and minimize damage to the stems. I always wear a sturdy pair of leather gloves and long sleeves because no matter how careful you are, thorny roses can painfully puncture or scratch your hands and arms. If you need to cut canes larger than one-half inch in diameter, use loppers.

Pruning hybrid tea and grandiflora roses

When pruning hybrid tea and grandiflora roses, first prune out all diseased or dead canes, cutting them back to their point of origin. Weak, spindly canes the diameter of a pencil or less should also be removed the same way. A good rose bush should have four to eight strong, healthy canes the diameter of your finger or larger after this first step.

The next step is to cut back the remaining canes to about 18 to 24 inches from ground level. When you prune back a cane, make the cut about one-quarter

inch above a dormant bud or newly sprouted side shoot. Try to cut back to buds that face outward, away from the center of the bush. The new shoot produced by the bud will grow outward, opening up the bush for light, air and orderly growth. This may seem picky, but this really does make a difference.

Pruning other types of roses

Everblooming old garden roses, floribunda roses, polyantha roses and landscape roses also are pruned in late January or early February. These roses, in general, have more pleasing shapes without severe pruning. They are only lightly shaped under most circumstances, unless there is a need to control their size.

If you need to control the size, first cut back especially tall, vigorous canes to about half the height of the rest of the bush. Then cut back or trim less vigorous growth to shape and reduce the overall size of the plant. Don't forget to prune out any dead or badly diseased canes as well.

A simpler method is often used, particularly on the popular Knock Out rose and its many variations. Cut these roses back about one-third in normal circumstances. Where size control is needed - these shrubs can easily reach 6 feet tall and wide - cut the bushes back about two-thirds, but don't cut them shorter than 18 inches from the ground.

Pruning once-blooming roses

Any roses that are not everblooming, including many climbing and rambling roses (such as Lady Banks, Dorothy Perkins, Cherokee and Blaze) and some antique varieties (such as Seven Sisters and Marie Louis), should not be pruned now. These roses

Arkansas man arrested for alleged timber theft

Baton Rouge, LA (January 31, 2013) – An Arkansas man was arrested by Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) enforcement agents and charged with five counts of timber theft Wednesday morning.

David Mallard, 51, of 622 East Pope Street, Taylor, Ark., was arrested and booked into the Bayou Dorcheat Detention Center in Webster Parish and charged with five felony counts of theft of

timber valued at nearly \$42,000. The arrest was the result of a two-month long investigation in which investigators found Mallard, who was operating as Stateline Timber Services during July - August 2012, had forged timber deeds from three Webster Parish landowners. These fraudulent deeds were then sold to a timber company in Springhill which is about 25 miles north of Minden near the Arkansas line.

“We aggressively pursue timber theft complaints in an effort to protect landowners and one of the largest industries in the state. We encourage anyone who is aware of this type of activity to please contact our Office of Forestry at 225-925-4500,” said LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

According to forestry investigators, Mallard was paid in full by the timber company and when the

timber company began cutting these timber tracts, they were informed by owners that they had not given permission for their timber to be cut nor had they been paid.

Enforcement agents say the timber company tried to recover their money from Mallard which resulted in two additional theft charges.

Mallard was released after posting a \$25,000 bond.

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

Pasta with Crawfish and Tasso

1/2 lb. penne pasta	1 tsp. white pepper
4 tbsp. butter	1/2 tsp. cayenne pepper
1/4 lb. Tasso	salt to taste
1 1/2 cup chopped green onions	1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat
4 cloves garlic, minced	1/4 cup parsley, minced
2 cups heavy cream	

Cook pasta according to package directions, being careful not to overcook. Rinse in cold water and set aside. Melt butter in skillet. Dice the Tasso, 1/4" or smaller. Sauté in butter until lightly browned. Add garlic, stir and cook 1 minute. Add cream, white pepper, cayenne and salt. While stirring constantly, bring to a boil and cook 2 minutes, until cream is reduced by about 1/4 and slightly thickened. Add crawfish tailmeat and parsley, return to a boil and cook 1 minute. Add pasta, mixing well, and cook until pasta is heated through.

1 cup chopped celery	1/2 cup sour cream
1/2 cup chopped bell pepper	1/2 cup grapes, halved
1/2 cup butter or margarine	1/2 cup bread crumbs
1/2 cup diced tomatoes	1 cup grated cheese
1 tbsp. sweet pickle relish	Salt & pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Cut cucumbers in half lengthwise. Scoop out the seeds, leaving the "meat." Steam cucumbers for 8 minutes and set aside. Sauté onions, celery and bell pepper in butter or margarine. Remove from heat. Add sour cream, grapes, breadcrumbs and cheese. Mix well and mound into cucumber shells. Bake at 400 degrees for 10 minutes.

Crawfish & Cheese Manicotti

1 box manicotti noodles	1 tbsp. garlic powder
1 lb. mozzarella cheese	1 tbsp. parsley
1 lb. Longhorn colby cheese	2 eggs
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese	1 (16-oz.) jar chunky spaghetti sauce
2lbs. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	1/2 cup oil
1/2 cup Italian bread crumbs	Salt & pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large pot, heat water to boiling. Add oil and drop noodles singly into boiling water. Boil until soft, drain and rinse. Cut cheese into cubes. Mix all ingredients except spaghetti sauce and fill noodles. Place noodles in a single layer into baking dish. Cover with spaghetti sauce. Bake at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes. Serves 4.

Crawfish Stuffed Jalapeno Peppers

1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	1/4 tsp. garlic powder
10 oz. cream cheese, softened	Salt & pepper to taste
3 tbsps. grated onion	3/4 lb. jalapeno peppers
3 tps. Worcestershire sauce	Red & green pepper slices

Pat crawfish tailmeat dry with paper towels and chop. Beat cream cheese until fluffy. Stir in crawfish, onion, Worcestershire, garlic powder, salt and pepper. Cover and chill. Rinse whole peppers and remove stem ends. Cut whole peppers in half lengthwise and remove seeds. Wear rubber gloves when working with peppers. Stuff pepper halves with crawfish mixture and garnish with additional pepper slices. For added zip, sprinkle with Cajun/Creole seasoning before garnishing. Makes about 30 appetizers.

Three-Cheese Crawfish Quiche

1/2 cup chopped onions	1/2 cup shredded Swiss cheese
1 tbsp. vegetable oil	1/2 cup shredded mozzarella
2 cup cooked rice	5 eggs, beaten
1 med. tomato, chopped & drained	2/3 cup light cream
1/4 tsp. salt	1 tsp. Cajun seasoning
1/4 tsp. pepper	1/4 tsp. nutmeg
1 cup chopped, cooked spinach	1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper
2 cups Louisiana crawfish tailmeat	1/4 cup grated Parmesan

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cook onions in oil in large skillet over medium heat. Stir in rice, all but 1/4 cup tomato, salt and pepper. Cook 2-3 minutes. Press rice into a greased 9" deep-dish pie plate. Spread spinach over rice mixture, top with crawfish, then with Swiss and mozzarella cheeses. Combine eggs, cream, seasoning, nutmeg and cayenne in a small bowl. Pour over cheese layer. Sprinkle with reserved tomato, then with Parmesan cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes or until firm and golden brown. Serves 6.

Hot Crawfish Loaves

1/2 cup flour	Salt & pepper to taste
1/2 cup melted butter	Dash of hot pepper sauce
3 cup milk	1 lb. Louisiana crawfish tailmeat
1/2 onion, chopped	1 cup chopped mushrooms
1/4 cup chopped bell pepper	1 small jar chopped pimento, drained
1/4 cup minced celery	Individual French bread loaves

Make a cream sauce by blending flour into melted butter and slowly adding milk, whisking until creamy. Sauce should be fairly thick. In another pan, sauté onion, bell pepper and celery in a little butter until onion is golden. Add to sauce. Season with salt, pepper and hot sauce. Stir in crawfish, mushrooms and pimentos. Stir until heated thoroughly. Cut French bread loaves in half, heat and fill with hot crawfish mixture.

Have you sold cattle on the farm?

The beef check-off law goes into effect every time cattle are sold. This includes purebred sales and private treaty sales on the farm. The law requires that you must collect the national, plus the 50 cents state check-off money during your sale. The 50 cents state check-off is now a Mandatory Collection as a result of Act 298 passed in the 1995 Louisiana legislature, but producers may request a refund of this amount only, by written request to the Louisiana Beef Industry Council.

The seller is also responsible under the law. The seller may collect and remit the \$1.50 per head in a private treaty transaction. This is the best way to handle purebred sales. To avoid a late payment charge, money must be remitted by the 15th of the month following the sale. Penalties of up to \$5,000 per transaction applies to violators. All sale transactions are subject to audit to insure compliance with the check-off law.

LDAF held wildland firefighting field day

Field day participants practice fire shelter deployment after learning about suitable deployment sites, deployment techniques, proper alignment to the fire front and airway protection.

Each wildland firefighter is required to carry a fire shelter during wildfire suppression efforts. These shelters are only used as a last resort. The individual must lie on the ground and cover their body with the “aluminum foil” type shelter to deflect radiant heat as the fire passes around or over them.



Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry hosted a Wildland Firefighter Field Day for 45 LDAF Office of Forestry employees at the Alexander State Forest near Woodworth, La.

The field day training was the final requirement needed for the employ-

ees to earn their National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) Type 2 Firefighter certification.

Prior to the field day, the employees completed about 40 hours of classroom and online instruction, in addition to their regular duties, to meet federal wildland firefighter stan-

dards. This nationally recognized certification will allow the firefighters to participate on both state and federal wildfire incidents.

Training, both classroom studies and hands-on, is vital for hazardous duty positions like wildland firefighters. From bulldozer operation to fire

shelter deployment, individuals are instructed on how to mitigate the various hazards of the position.

LDAF currently employs 114 NWCG certified wildland firefighters to protect approximately 18.9 million acres of forest and pasturelands statewide.

produce their flowers in one big gush during late spring and early summer on growth made the previous year, and then they bear few or no flowers the rest of the year. If pruned hard now, they will produce few, if any, flowers. If extensive pruning is necessary, it is best done in midsummer after they have finished flowering.

Pruning climbing roses and ramblers is

largely determined by how large you want them to be and what type of structure they are being trained to grow on (fence, arbor, trellis, etc.). Pruning, when done, is more selective and less extensive.

First, prune off any canes that are growing in the wrong way or direction (such as away from the support). This will make it easier to train the remaining canes onto the support you have provided. Next, thin out

the remaining canes, if needed, cutting back the oldest, woodiest canes to within a foot of the ground. Carefully remove them from the remaining growth. Finally, do any other pruning needed to shorten, thin out and shape the climbing rose in order to train it attractively on its support. This can be done now for everblooming climbers, but wait until midsummer after flowering for those that don't repeat bloom.

Many nurseries already have their rose bushes in, and February is a good time to plant. Early planting allows rose bushes to become established before they begin to bloom. This increases the number and quality of flowers, and the bush is better-prepared to deal with summer heat when it arrives in May. Plant roses in a sunny, well-prepared bed that has excellent drainage.
