Louisiana horticulture official appointed to national board

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) Horticulture and Quarantine Assistant Director Ansel Rankins, Sr., was recently selected as the 2013-2014 Member Board Executive (MBE) Observer to the Board of Directors for the Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Boards (CLARB).

not only to be a conduit of information to all member board executives but also to provide the perspective of a Member Board Executive to the CLARB board of directors when it is deciding on enhancements to examination and other processes. Rankins will also serve as CLARB's MBE Committee Chair during the 2013-

2014 fiscal year.

Rankins has served on CLARB's MBE Committee since 2012, participated in numerous CLARB membership meetings, and volunteered as a CLARB social media "ambassador" monitoring and responding to comments made on CLARB's social media channels as well as other social media sites.

CLARB and its members work together to establish standards for education, experience and examination required for the professional licensure of landscape architects. CLARB's members include the licensure boards that regulate the profession of landscape architecture in the United States; Puerto Rico; and the Canadian provinces of Alberta, British Columbia and Ontario.



Caddo Parish man arrested a fourth time in connection with timber theft

Baton Rouge, La. (October 8, 2013) – For the fourth time in less than three months, a Greenwood man has been arrested by Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) enforcement agents and charged, this time, with one count of theft by fraud of timber and one count of attempted felony theft.

David Lubas, 61, of 7500 Waterwood Drive, Greenwood, was booked into the Claiborne Parish jail in Homer Friday morning. He was charged with theft by fraud of timber valued at approximately \$37,700 and attempted felony theft of timber valued at approximately \$10,000.

Investigators say Lubas was working as a consultant forester when a Claiborne Parish absentee landowner, asked him to help sell her timber. Lubas reportedly told the landowner he had solicited bids and had obtained a high bid of \$28,228 for her timber. At that point, the landowner signed a contract with the logging company and received a lump sum payment for her timber.

Unknown to the landowner, investigators say Lubas actually received a high bid of \$65,928. According to statements from the logging company, Lubas directed the company to issue him two checks totaling \$37,700 in which one was listed as commission and the other was listed as site prep, burning and planting cost for services that were to be per-

formed on the property which were never performed.

After receiving the check for \$28,228, investigators say Lubas sent a bill to the landowner for a 12 percent commission. The landowner then sent Lubas a payment for \$3,387.36.

The charge of attempted felony theft stems from a family of four Claiborne Parish absentee landowners who hired Lubas to sell their timber. Lubas reportedly told the landowners he found a timber company to cut the timber on a pay-as-cut basis and got the best prices possible. According to investigators, all four landowners signed the contract and the logging company was less than two weeks away from moving in on the property when Lubas was arrested in early August and the landowners stopped the sale.

Investigators found Lubas had directed the timber company to withhold money for a commission which would have resulted in Lubas receiving at least \$10,000.

"If any other landowners believe they've had dealings with Mr. Lubas, we urge you to contact the Department of Agriculture and Forestry at 225-925-4500. It's important that we collect as much information as possible to ensure that we stop people accused of these types of crimes," said Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M.

Strain urges Congressional leaders to take action

As I write this, the government shutdown continues and our country's farmers, the providers of our food supply, remains in limbo as a result of there being no farm bill. When the one-year extension expired September 30 and the government shutdown went into effect, it put a stop to solidifying a five-year farm bill or extension of the 2008 farm bill that would give our agricultural producers some certainty for their future.

So now we wait and so do our farmers. Right now, farmers are

unable to make critical decisions regarding next year's crop because they don't have certain protections the farm bill provides such as setting commodity prices (ie: milk and bread), providing disaster assistance, and restoring research funding. Research and technology ensures that our food is produced as efficiently as possible and the safest and healthiest way possible.

Speaking of food safety, this government shutdown is putting us all at risk. Much of our food, with the exception of meat and poultry, is

not being inspected because federal agencies (Federal Drug Administration and Centers for Disease Control) that conduct these inspections are closed. That means we are at greater risk for potentially dangerous bacterial diseases.

In an industry that is full of uncertainties because of unpredictable weather conditions and other hazards, the last thing agriculture producers need is a government shutdown and Congress' inaction regarding a long term farm bill that will provide some security for

our country's ag producers.

We left things with the House Republicans voting to separate the agriculture portion of the bill from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program aspect of the bill. In essence, the farm bill remains in limbo any way you slice it.

I urge our Congressional leaders to work on a comprehensive bill once they compromise on the government shutdown issues. We need to protect one of America's largest industries - agriculture.

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FOOTBALL FAVORITES

Cheese and Green Chili Squares

2 cups warm cooked rice	3-4 tbsps. chopped pimientos
1 (4 oz.) can green chilies, chopped	2 tbsps. chopped pitted olives
2 ½ cups grated Monterey Jack cheese	6 eggs, slightly beaten
	1 tsp. salt

Combine rice, chilies, cheese, pimientos and olives in mixing bowl. Add eggs and salt. Pour into a buttered 9"x13" baking pan. Bake in preheated 350 degree oven (325 degrees using a glass oven proof dish) 30 minutes, or until set. Cut into 1 ¼ inch squares. Serve at once, or refrigerate and serve later.

Cheese Straws

1 (10 oz.) pkg. piecrust mix	2 egg yolks
1 cup grated sharp Cheddar cheese	Milk
¼ teaspoon curry powder	Paprika or sesame seeds

Combine piecrust mix with cheese and curry powder. Add egg yolks and mix with fork. (If dough is too stiff, add a little milk with fork to combine.) Roll out on floured board to 1/8 inch thickness. Sprinkle lightly with paprika, or brush with milk and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Cut into a 3"x ½" strips. Bake on greased cookie sheet in preheated 425 degrees oven 8-10 minutes. Cool on a rack. Serve hot or cold.

Mardi Gras Pasta

1/8 lb butter	1 can cream of shrimp soup
1 onion, chopped	1 pint whipping cream
1 each, green and yellow bell peppers, chopped,	1 tsp. lemon/pepper seasoning
1 lb. La. crawfish tails	½ tsp. liquid crab boil
1 box frozen corn	2 tsps. Creole seasoning
2 cups boiled potatoes, diced	1 cup green onion tops, chopped
	1 lb. tri-color pasta, cooked

Sauté butter, onions, peppers until clear. Add crawfish and corn; simmer 10 minutes. Add potatoes, soup and cream; simmer 10 minutes. Add remaining seasonings. Adjust salt to suit your taste. Toss with pasta and serve. Serve with salad and French bread. Serves 6.

Hot-wings

¼ cup butter	¼ tsp. paprika
¼ cup your favorite Louisiana hot sauce	¼ tsp. cayenne pepper
¼ tsp. ground black pepper	¼ tsp. salt
½ tsp. garlic powder	10 chicken wings, separated
½ cup flour	Vegetable oil for frying

Combine flour, paprika, cayenne pepper and salt in a bowl. Coat wings evenly with the flour mix, and place them in a refrigerator for 1-2 hours. The "cool" will help keep the flour on the wings while they are frying.

Heat oil in a deep fryer to 375 degrees. Combine the butter, hot sauce, ground pepper and garlic powder in a pan over low heat. Place the wing in the hot oil and cook 12 minutes. Place on tray to absorb some of the oil. Place cooked wings in large bowl and coat evenly with the hot sauce mixture. Serve hot with celery and blue cheese dressing

Seafood and Andouille Cajun Pasta

1 stick butter	2 cups heavy cream
¼ cup chopped green onions	½ cup chopped red and/or green bell peppers
1 garlic clove, minced	1 tsp. nutmeg
½ cup chopped mushrooms	4 oz. cream cheese, cut into cubes
½ cup chopped andouille	½ cup grated Parmesan
1 lb. La. crawfish tails with fat or de-veined small shrimp	¼ cup chopped fresh parsley
2 oz. dry white wine or sherry	Salt and cracked pepper to taste
1 tbsp. lemon juice	24 oz. cooked pasta,
1 (10 oz.) can tomatoes with green chilies	

Melt the butter in a heavy 3-quart skillet over medium-high heat. Add the green onions, garlic, mushrooms, and andouille. Sauté for 5 minutes. Add the crawfish. Cook for 3 minutes. Add the Cognac and lemon juice, stirring to deglaze the skillet. Add the tomatoes with green chilies. Cook until the liquid is reduced by ½. Reduce the heat to medium. Add the heavy cream, bell peppers and nutmeg. Cook 5 minutes or until thickened, stirring constantly. Add the cream cheese and Parmesan cheese. Cook for 5 minutes or until the cream cheese melts, stirring frequently. Remove from the heat. Stir in the parsley, salt and black pepper. Fold in the pasta. Sprinkle with paprika.

Have You Sold Cattle on the Farm?

The beef check-off law goes into effect every time cattle are sold. This includes purebred sales and private treaty sales on the farm. The law requires that you must collect the national, plus the 50 cents state check-off money during your sale. The 50 cents state check-off is now a Mandatory Collection as a result of Act 298 passed in the 1995 Louisiana legislature, but producers may request a refund of this amount only, by written request to the Louisiana Beef Industry Council.

The seller is also responsible under the law. The seller may collect and remit the \$1.50 per head in a private treaty transaction. This is the best way to handle purebred sales. To avoid a late payment charge, money must be remitted by the 15th of the month following the sale. Penalties of up to \$5,000 per transaction applies to violators. All sale transactions are subject to audit to insure compliance with the check-off law.

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Timber Theft

Don't be a victim... **BE INFORMED**

Louisiana timber resources annually provide \$377 million in stumpage value to the landowners of our state and contributed over \$2.8 billion to Louisiana's economy. Timber is the leading agricultural crop and the second leading industry in Louisiana producing 13,000 jobs. The most vulnerable person in this economic process is the private landowner, especially those who know little about the value of their timber or the proper way to contract the harvesting. Remember, your trees are a valuable asset representing many years of investment before contributing to your financial livelihood.

KNOW THE VALUE OF YOUR TIMBER

If you need help, representatives of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF) can guide you. You may decide to seek professional assistance in managing your forest resources for optimum return.

BOUNDARY LINES

Make sure lines are correct and well-marked. A description of the property can be obtained at the courthouse in the parish where the land is located. This will prevent honest mistakes and will add to the chain of evidence if theft occurs.

VISIT THE PROPERTY

Visit frequently if possible. Make sure no unauthorized logging is taking place. Visit logging sites daily when you have a harvest operation on your property-including firewood cutting-or when there is harvesting on the adjacent property.

ABSENTEE LANDOWNERS

You are especially vulnerable.

If you live too far from your property to visit it frequently, arrange for an overseer. This overseer might be a paid employee, a professional forestry consultant, a hunting club, a friend or neighboring landowner, or a combination of these. Notify local authorities that you are an absentee landowner and ask them to let you (or designated person) know of any suspicious activities on your land; in turn, let them know when there are to be legitimate harvesting or other management activities on your woodlands.

SELLING TIMBER

Check with the nearest LDAF location (find locations at www.LDAF.la.gov) to learn about available services and assistance. Draw up a contract that:

- Spells out limitations and conditions of the sale and method of logging,
- Gives an estimate of volume to be cut (cruise or tree count)
- Identifies trees to be harvested
- Is signed by both the buyer and seller

The Office of Forestry recommends that the lump-sum sale method be used and that bids be obtained from as many buyers as possible.

Monitor the terms of your contract when harvesting begins.

TIMBER SALES CONTRACT

Always have a written contract and have an attorney and forester who represent your interest review the contract before signing.

Contracts should include:

- ◆ Name and address of seller and purchaser
- ◆ Amount of money to be received (lump sum or per unit) and when payments should be made and where sent
- ◆ Performance bond
- ◆ Expiration date
- ◆ Best Management Practices
- ◆ Clauses to protect improvements and excluded trees

IF THEFT OCCURS

Report the theft as soon as possible to the LDAF at 225-925-4500, local sheriff's office or both. Provide as much detailed information as possible. To facilitate this, make written notes for yourself as you learn information.
