Practice, practice, practice

Avian influenza has got animal health officials across the globe making plans to contain any outbreak. LDAF officials want to make sure Louisiana is prepared. How do they do that?

Practice, practice, practice.

"The threat of an avian influenza outbreak remains a major concern and animal health officials want to be certain all personnel are properly trained in case of a contagion," said Dr. Henry Moreau, LDAF state veterinarian.

To be prepared, Animal Health Services recently hosted an Avian Influenza Response Tabletop Exercise at the East Baton Rouge Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness.

More than 45 participants representing multiple agencies and industry, including the LDAF's Livestock Sanitary Board, state veterinary medical officers, Animal Health Barn supervisors, Animal Health technicians and Brand Enforcement personnel attended. Additionally, the Louisiana Animal Disease Diagnostic Lab at the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine, LSU AgCenter and Louisiana Office of Public Health's Public Health Veterinarian also took part in the drill.

Rounding out the list of attendees was industry's Pilgrim's Pride poultry plant representatives and USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Veterinary Services branch and Centers for Epidemiology and Animal Health personnel.

The exercise was facilitated by instructors from the Agricultural Preparedness Center of Kirkwood Community College of Cedar Rapids, Iowa who also evaluated the response according to Homeland Security Exercise Evaluation Program guidelines.

The exercise ended with a

demonstration by LDAF personnel performing response tasks while dressed in personal protective equipment.

The exercise tested the capability of the LDAF's Foreign Animal Disease Rapid Response Team to respond to an outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI).

Avian influenza (AI) is a virus that causes disease and high mortality in various types of birds, thus the common name "bird flu."

AI viruses can infect chickens, turkeys, pheasants, quail, ducks, geese and guinea fowl as well as a wide variety of other birds, including migratory waterfowl.

AI is primarily spread by direct contact between healthy and infected birds through respiratory secretions and feces. The disease also can be spread through indirect contact if healthy birds are exposed to contaminated equipment or materials.

Of particular concern is the HPI H5N1 virus.

"The HPI H5N1 virus can be spread, under certain conditions, from birds to people as a result of extensive direct contact with infected birds," Moreau said. "That virus is the one that animal health and medical people are most concerned about."

This aspect of the disease presents a particular challenge to emergency responders who must perform their response activities while wearing cumbersome personal protection equipment to prevent personal exposure to the virus.

Veterinarian Diane Stacy, the LDAF's emergency response training coordinator, said the personal

protection equipment responders must wear creates its own set of problems for the South.

"In Louisiana's heat, working in Tyvek suits and respirators will be quite challenging," Stacy said. "We even had safety personnel on hand to monitor the responders."

The exercise was specific for avian influenza, but the team has trained to respond to all foreign animal diseases such as Foot and Mouth Disease and Classical Swine Fever, Moreau said.

"This was the first exercise for the team that involved a simulated outbreak of H5N1 Avian Influenza at a local fair," Moreau said. "This practice is essential for the team in order to hone the skills necessary to respond to an actual disease outbreak."

Moreau said the H5N1 strain of HPAI has not yet been found in the U.S., but the disease has been found in Europe, the United Kingdom, Asia, the Mideast, and Africa.

The rapid spread of the disease, especially in Asia, has public health officials in the U.S. concerned.

LDAF Commissioner Mike Strain was encouraged with the progress of the Louisiana team.

"The response team, under Dr. Moreau's direction, has undergone intense training to learn how to respond to a foreign animal disease," Strain said. "I'm confident we have the right people in place with the right training to minimize any animal health issue we could face."

Strain said the team's online and classroom training in FEMA's National Incident Management System-Incident Command System and USDA's National Animal Health Emergency Management System guidelines provided the team with the basic information to control an avian flu outbreak.


"We're always thinking positive, but preparing for the worse," Strain said. "Let's hope they never have to use their training."

Strain stressed the importance of proper biosecurity on poultry farms and in backyard and hobbyist flocks.

"New birds represent a risk to your established flock so quarantining them is always a good idea," Strain said. "Avoid putting new birds, including baby chicks, in contact with droppings and feathers of leftover flocks."

"Always wash your hands after handling poultry. It's just good common sense measures. If everybody practices good biosecurity then Louisiana shouldn't have any problems."

Commissioner recounts first 100 days in office

Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M., celebrated his first 100 days in office recently at a breakfast and coffee meeting with staff and other well-wishers.

The gathering was held in the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's Veterans Memorial Auditorium.

Strain said the refurbishing of the auditorium and public nature of the breakfast meeting is symbolic of his overall vision for the LDAF.

"We are conducting all our public hearings and commission meetings in this room," Strain said. "Everything about this administra-

tion will be above board, open to the public and transparent."

Strain said his first weeks in office were hectic.

"I hit the road running and haven't stopped since," Strain said. "I've traveled the state making speeches and LDAF presentations to 68 organizations in 100 days."

"I've told the farmers, foresters, parish farm bureaus, consumer groups, everyone I possibly can, how much agriculture and forestry touches almost every aspect of their lives."

Strain said he created an environment of reform within the LDAF and is proud of the workforce and their dedication.

"It's important for the citizens of Louisiana to know that their LDAF employees are here to serve the needs of the public," he said.

One of the immediate changes Strain instituted was the halt of all building construction using LDAF office staff and others not trained for industrial work.

"Remember, we are going to be as transparent as possible," Strain said. "We've gone to great lengths to make sure each employee is doing the job he or she is trained to do."

Strain said other noteworthy achievements of his administration's first 100 days include:

- required statutory oaths of

office for all appointed positions

- revised purchasing procedures
- reduced fleet inventory and fuel costs


- implemented employee training and development programs

- revised personnel and substance abuse policies

- launched an information-packed Web site.

Strain reiterated his pledge to keep Louisiana agriculture and forestry strong.

Recipes

Cajun Deviled Eggs

2 dozen eggs, boiled
1 pound crawfish tails, peeled
1 cup crab, crawfish or shrimp
boil powder
3/4 - 1 cup mayonnaise
Salt and black pepper to taste
Granulated garlic to taste
Paprika to garnish

Place peeled crawfish tails in a medium pot and add enough water to cover. Stir in crab boil powder then bring to a boil over medium heat. Boil for approximately 10 minutes then remove from heat and allow crawfish to soak in liquid for 10-15 minutes. While crawfish are soaking, cut eggs in half lengthwise and carefully remove yolks. Place yolks in a mixing bowl and mash with a fork then set aside. Drain crawfish but do not rinse. To the mashed yolks, add crawfish and enough mayonnaise to hold mixture together. If desired, season to taste with salt, pepper and granulated garlic. Stuff egg white halves with crawfish mixture and garnish with paprika. Serve warm or chill for at least 1 hour to serve cold.

organize the cattle rescue effort and was very interested in learning how the new corrals would work in a real life situation.

"The new pens will be a great tool in rescuing lost or stranded animals in times of emergencies, and the more we get acquainted with operating the pens the more efficient we'll be in rescuing animals," Moreau said.

The cattle rescue began with an early morning pre-planning session to coordinate the multiple agencies involved in the rescue.

Pointe Coupee Parish Sheriff deputies stationed several patrol cars near the levee on Hwy. 1. Two Wildlife and Fisheries enforcement agents, along with their flatboats, were on stand-by in order to help drive the cattle down the levee.

Robillard also employed the services of several neighbors and nearby cattlemen to facilitate the rescue.

"The cattle were definitely spooked," Robillard said. "We knew that going in and we were trying to be patient.

"One cow jumped into the water just as we were penning her, then about three dozen head followed her into the water. We let them settle a bit and eventually recovered them all."

Several bags of cattle pellets were also used to lure the cattle into the pens.

According to Gill and Moreau, the pens proved valuable in the cattle rescue effort.

"The pens served to corral and funnel the cows into waiting trailers," Gill said. "They worked as designed and will be a real asset to the department and to cattlemen across the state."

By 1 p.m. all 200 head were rounded up and transported to higher ground.

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Til the cows come home

With hurricane season fast approaching, LDAF emergency personnel underwent a shakedown cruise with new portable cow pens and helped beleaguered cattlemen round up flood-stranded cattle in the Morganza Spillway

Rising waters from the nearby Mississippi River prompted the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's Office of Animal Health Services into action as part of "Operation Cattle Rescue."

The situation turned dire in Pointe Coupee Parish as nearly 200 head of cattle were quickly running out of pasture atop a Morganza Spillway levee.

In early April, rising water from the Mississippi River flooded about 1,500 acres of winter wheat within the forebay area of

crested higher than normal and funneled more water into the Morganza Spillway.

Unfortunately for the farmers' wheat crops, the low levee was overtopped.

But the stranded cattle were spared the same fate as the wheat crop, thanks in large part to the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry's Office of Animal Health Services and a supply of new portable livestock pens,

Pointe Coupee Parish cattleman Brett Robillard notified the local Office of

gry and I knew I needed some assistance with moving the cattle to higher ground," Robillard said.

Several local and state agencies were involved following the initial request for assistance including the LDAF, the Pointe Coupee Parish Sheriff's office and the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries.

Joshua Gill of the LDAF's Office of Animal Health Services is the Agricultural Emergency Support Coordinator who initiated the department's "Incident Action Plan."

"I got the call late Sunday afternoon and by early Tuesday morning all the people and agencies were in place and ready for the cattle rescue," Gill said.

In addition to rescuing cattle, the event also served as a training session for LDAF personnel to get acquainted with the mov-

able livestock pens. The pens were acquired through a grant from Homeland Security and are used to corral cattle and horses during crisis or emergency situations.

the Morganza Spillway. Local farmers, working alongside U.S. Army Corps of Engineers crews, tried to stave off the tide by filling large sandbags and placing them on top a low crop-protection levee within the spillway.

The crop-protection levee usually protects bottomland fields from the normal spillway water but this year the Mississippi River

Emergency Preparedness when he realized his cattle might be in danger.

By late April, the Mississippi River had yet to crest and Robillard's Brahman-cross cattle were losing ground to flood water. His herd migrated atop the Morganza levees when the nearby levee was breeched in early April.

"The cattle were getting scared and hun-
