You can trust your car...

Gasoline prices are creeping up to \$4 a gallon. Oil is trading at more than \$120 a barrel.

While high oil prices are good for the Louisiana economy in the forms of better paying jobs, more offshore oil exploration and increased revenues for the state, it sure feels painful when you're filling up the flivver with \$50 of liquid gold.

As the numbers fly by on the gas pump's digital reader, the concerned consumer has got to ask himself one question: "Is this gas pump accurate?"

The Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry is doing its best to make sure that every gas pump in the state, from Grand Isle to Lake Providence and Holly Beach to Homer, is accurate to the most exacting degree.

Benjy Rayburn, LDAF Assistant Commissioner of Agro-Consumer Services, said the LDAF is the state agency responsible for ensuring the correct calibration of gas pumps, commercial scales, bar code scanners, taxi cab meters, packaged food commodities and flow meters.


High gas prices have put the gas pump in the center stage, Rayburn said.

"Money is tight and consumers don't want to be shorted by an inaccurate pump," Rayburn said. "We're making sure that doesn't happen.

"LDAF understands completely that the consumer needs to be confident he or she is paying the precise amount of money for the precise amount of gas."

Rayburn said the LDAF normally gets about 530 consumer inquiries annually to check gas pumps, but with \$3.80 a gallon gas prices, consumer complaints are up

Long gone are the days of 30 cents a gallon gasoline. With fuel prices higher than ever how does the consumer trust the gas pump? LDAF gas pump inspectors make sure that every pump in the state rings true.



LDAF test measures assure state consumers they are getting the gas they pay for. Gas pumps are checked at least once a year for accuracy by LDAF inspectors before an "approved" sticker can be issued. 30%.

By law every gas pump dispenser in the state must be checked by LDAF inspectors at least once a year.

"That's 64,000 nozzles and 3,300 gas stations," Rayburn said. "In addition to calibration, our inspectors ensure there are no leaky nozzles or hoses and the pumps are in safe operating condition."

Rayburn said a team of 39 LDAF inspectors hits the road every week to check gas pumps.

A calibration test consists of pumping five gallons of gas into special test measures mounted on LDAF pickup trucks. The stainless steel test measures are calibrated by the LDAF metrology laboratory to ensure accuracy. The LDAF metrology lab is in turn certified by the U.S. government's National Institute of Standards and Technology.

"A gallon of gas is 231 cubic inches," Rayburn said. "Five gallons of gas is 1,155 cubic inches. The commercial gas pump must dispense gas to within a .5 percent tolerance, plus or minus."

Rayburn added that all gas pumps at a single location must be set as close to zero tolerance as possible to eliminate any plus or minus bias in the testing.

What happens if a gas pump is not accurate enough?

Rayburn said gas station owners are given up to 72 hours to recalibrate the pump or the nozzle may be taken out of service.

A pump can also be shut down if it is not safe.

"Gas station owners know how important it is to keep the public's trust and they strive to comply with the rules and regulations set forth

LDAF delegates honored

Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. recently honored the three May 2008 LDAF employees of the month with a breakfast in the Commissioner's conference room.

Clerk David Gremillion, Administrative Assistant Thelma Earls and Public Information Officer Sam Irwin were the initial recipients of the "LDAF Delegate" recognition.

Gremillion clerks in the LDAF mailing services section and first came to work for the LDAF as a student worker in 2002. He left the department briefly when he finished his schooling but returned as a full-timer in May 2007.

Gremillion now has three years with the LDAF.

His duties entail daily trips to the post office, collecting mail from departmental mailboxes and delivering paperwork to the proper recipients.

by the LDAF," Rayburn said. "It's all designed to protect the consumer."

Consumers can call the LDAF Division of Weights & Measures at 1-800-247-1086 if they have questions concerning gasoline quality or measurements.

Edmunds says drive slower

Despite all the so-called tips on how to economize your fuel, the best way to conserve gasoline is simply to drive slower.

Philip Reed and Mike Hudson, editors for the Web automobile specialist Edmunds.com, said slowing down and using the cruise control can help the consumer save a lot of gas.

"The cruise control smoothes out the driver's accelerator input by preventing nervous 'surging,'" Reed and Hudson said.

The Edmunds editors also found that driving less aggressively could lead to substantial savings.

"Our test showed that the most significant way to save gas is you," Reed and Hudson advised. "Don't mash the gas when you start up. Take the long view of the road and brake easy."

"If you slowed your 0-to-60-mph acceleration time down from your current 10 seconds to a more normal city pace of 15 seconds, you'll feel the savings immediately."

Hudson and Reed said turning off the A/C did not have any significant gas savings and advised making yourself comfortable when you drive.

La. Agriculture & Forestry Today

Two arrested in separate incidents of timber theft

Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Commissioner Mike Strain, D.V.M. said two suspects were recently arrested on separate timber theft charges.

A St. Francisville woman was arrested and charged May 12 with felony theft by forestry enforcement investigators with the LDAF for allegedly scamming Georgia Pacific Corporation-Port Hudson Operation out of timber valued at more than \$22,000.

LDAF Forestry Enforcement Investigator Mark Singleton and Captain Spence Dilworth of the West Feliciana Sheriff's Office arrested Chakena A. Morrison, 32,

of 8031 Solitude Road, St. Francisville and booked her as a fugitive from East Baton Rouge Parish.

Singleton's investigation determined that during August and September of 2007, Morrison, a security guard at the Georgia Pacific-Port Hudson mill, falsified timber scale tickets defrauding Georgia Pacific Corporation in the amount of \$22,751.49.

"The investigation is continuing and additional arrests are expected," Strain added.

In a second unrelated case, a Texas man was arrested on felony theft charges by Texas authorities for allegedly stealing Louisiana

timber valued at more than \$51,000, Strain said.

Albert D. Harrison, 52, of CR 3150, Deberry, Texas, was arrested on an outstanding warrant at his home March 28 by Panola County Sheriff's officers.

LDAF investigator John Terrell notified the Texas authorities.

Terrell's investigation determined Harrison was hired by an Arkansas logging company to handle the purchase of 160 timber acres; however, he resold 40 acres of the contracted timber to a Vivian, Louisiana logging outfit.

The timber acreage was located in Webster Parish.

"We take timber theft very seri-

ously and immediately looked into the allegations," Strain said. "It is my department's duty to protect Louisiana citizens from unscrupulous people preying on absent landowners or, in this case, out of state logging companies."

Strain advised anyone with information regarding timber theft, woods arson or agriculture-related crimes to contact the LDAF enforcement division.

"Call us at 1-800-558-9741 as soon as possible," Strain said. "The sooner the better. Don't wait to report a crime."

Criminal cases account for more than \$1.2 million annually in timber industry losses, Strain said.

June 13-15 and July 18-20 are the next scheduled dates.

Worsham said his merchant clients come from all walks of life and have established a community of sorts at the once a month fair.

"For a lot of people, it's a hobby," Worsham said. "For others, it's a main income.

"A lot of retired folks are merchants here. It gives them a chance to meet people and make new friends and acquaintances.

"It's like a family to them."

Merchants sell everything from livestock to lillies, antiques to engines and sculpture to jewelry.

"We had a guy selling a parachute once," Worsham said. "We have had a chain saw artist carving bears out of trees."

One of the more popular attractions is the Animal Alley.

The lane can feature almost every type of farm animal, including cows, horses and poultry, as well as dogs, cats and other pets.

Bonnie and Clyde Trade Days event planner Ejay Colvin said the most unusual pet she's ever seen at the fair was a South American possum.

"It's an itty bitty, tiny possum," Colvin said. "They make pets out of them."

Kelly Gamble and Casey Dooly of Minden are exotic poultry farmers and bring a colorful array of

chickens, ducks, quail and turkeys every month to the Trade Days.

Their booth is a large canopied tent stacked with poultry crates full of crowing roosters, clucking hens and gobbling turkeys.

"The bantams are our biggest sellers," Gamble said.

Gamble's male pheasants are also very picturesque and popular with customers.

"Most of the people like to buy the male pheasant and put them in the backyard because they like to look at them," Gamble said.

Gamble is a livestock farmer and also raises cows and goats at his Minden farm.

Though he's a third generation farmer, Gamble doesn't make his living from his livestock.

"Backyard poultry hobbyists are our main customers here at the Trade Days," Gamble said. "We're here every month. We do pretty good."

Worsham said Gamble and Dooley and the other livestock traders take great pride in offering top notch animals to the public.

"All the animal vendors practice good biosecurity," Worsham said. "LDAF personnel make periodic checks to ensure that all animal regulations are followed."

Local produce growers are also featured at the Trade Days.

"Last month we had growers

with squash, watermelons and tomatoes," Worsham said. "We're hoping to expand the produce section and set a regular farmers market in Arcadia."

René Simon, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry Assistant Commissioner of Marketing, said the Bonnie and Clyde Trade Days Animal Alley reflects the kind of grass roots marketing necessary to keep agriculture alive and well in Louisiana.

"Louisiana was built by the small farmer," Simon said. "We're really glad the Bonnie and Clyde Trade Days offers another venue for producers and growers."

Worsham said the market is also an entertainment destination with staged Western-style shootouts and skits, pop bands and other acts.


"We had a group of hot air balloonists last month," he said. "In June we're going to have chuck wagon races. We're trying to make it an entertaining day."

County Fair

Ray Worsham knows entertainment.

The 57-year-old got his start putting on large scale rodeos and convention productions in Dallas, Atlanta, Houston and other large markets.

He's done everything from setting up a replica of a surgery for a convention of surgical nurses to arranging hay for herds of cattle at livestock shows.

Worsham knows how to attract a crowd.

But after 30 years in the trade show business he decided to slow things down. That's why he bought the 133-acre Bonnie and Clyde Trade Days open air market in Arcadia on Hwy. 9.

Managing the 600-stall market doesn't exactly seem like a cake walk on the way to retirement, however. The Bonnie and Clyde Trade Days market draws thousands of shoppers and more than 200 vendors each month.

"I rent dirt," Worsham said from the porch of his office, a wooden cabin built above a man-made lake at the site. "My merchants are able to rent any size they need for their business."

"We're almost a complete city out here. We have our own water supply and sewer. The park is very well designed.

The Bonnie and Clyde Trade Days derives its catchy name from the notorious Depression-era outlaws Clyde Barrow and Bonnie Parker. Barrow and Parker were gunned down by a posse of lawmen barely ten miles from the fair in nearby Gibsland. A small stone monument on the side of Hwy. 154 marks the spot and is a tourist attraction in itself.


The Trade Days are held on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday before the third Monday of every month. **See County Fair, page 10**

County fairs used to be the high point of the month for rural families. It was a place to sell the milk, buy supplies, treat the kids to penny candies and find a bolt of calico for the Missus.

The Bonnie and Clyde Trade Days fair in Arcadia is a 133-acre show attracting vendors and buyers from the entire north half of the state. You can buy an exotic rooster, yard art or even a parachute.

You can camp overnight and tap your toe to a country hoedown on Saturday night.

It's just good old-fashioned fun.
